DISTRICT TIED FOR #1 IN TOP THREE DISTRICTS IN MD4

- organizing a recycling project to collect old eyeglasses, batteries and small electronics







Recently retired from teaching at Pueblo Elementary School, Lion Anne Henderson got to read to some of her former students. "The Henderson says, students asked me why I joined the Lions club and what we did."

Lions Flag Day was truly a multi-member endeavor. In addition to the six readers, who visited the schools, other members helped with cutting, drilling and sanding the wood flag bases, with gluing, with making labels and scarves for the stuffed lions.




