

What a great start to the new year! Our District 4-L4 clubs have been doing outstanding work in serving their communities and in increasing the number of Lions hands in service! Keep up the great job!

We've had a fast start in **membership growth** and we expect even more under the Global Membership Team (GMT) leadership of Dave Hubbard, supported by his team of PDG PJ Smith, Steve Christy, PDG Norm MacKenzie, plus the Governors and Region and Zone Chairs. Our District membership started the year at 1,233 (which included two new clubs chartered in IPDG Sheila's year) and already we have reached over 1,250 and still growing. Your Governors Team (Gil, Ken and Bob) look forward to the opportunity to participate in the induction of your new members.

Valuable **leadership opportunities** will be offered all year, under the guidance of the Global Leadership Team (GLT) Coordinator IPDG Sheila Casteel and her committee of PDG Jack Mauller plus the Governors and Region and Zone Chairs. I encourage you to participate in these trainings as they are designed to help strengthen your club, your leaders and your service.

The first **District Meeting** of the year on July 26th was a rousing success with 119 Lions plus our ten Youth Exchange Program (YEP) students from other countries in attendance.

Our day was highlighted by the contributions of Past International Director (PID) Bill Crawford. PID Bill gave a moving installation of the District Cabinet. He also provided two inspiring and valuable presentations during the leadership academy in the morning and as the keynote speaker after lunch. Both of his discussions focused on effective leadership, one of the pillars of Lionism. Over 40 Lions attended the leadership academy before the District meeting began - the dining room virtually emptied when it was announced that the academy was beginning at 8:45 a.m. The feedback from Lions in attendance was great.

PID Bill Crawford also honored Lion Scott Newton of Seal Beach with his 50-member Grand Master Key Award from LCI for bringing in 50 new members. It is reported that he has now brought in 72 new members and was challenged by PID Bill to beat him to the 75 mark — it turns out PID Bill is currently at 74 members. PDG Ellen reports that the vast majority of members Scott has brought into Seal Beach are still members.

## DISTRICT 4-L4 MEETING FOCUSES ON LEADERSHIP

July 26, 2014



The July 26th District 4-L4 meeting focused on "Leadership," representing the "Lead" in Governor Gil Smith's theme, "Seize the Opportunities to Lead, Grow and Serve." Subsequent district meetings this year will focus on "Grow" and "Serve." Beginning the day was the Leadership Academy, led by Past International Director Bill Crawford, a dynamic presenter, who is the Global Leadership Director for the Western United States, Alaska and Hawaii. Over forty Lions took part in the interactive presentation on the difference of leadership and management, and what works best when.

During the general session, PID Crawford was the presiding officer for a meaningful installation of our district cabinet officers, and he delivered a powerful keynote speech on the "Characteristics of Effective Leaders." Governor Gil shared how the district will try to give value to all the clubs and encouraged everyone to seize the many opportunities to grow as leaders, to increase the number of members in service and to embrace the needs in our communities.

The meeting had its light moments, jokes and pranks. Governor Gil was told to close his eyes as Convention Chair PDG Dan Mayer and Judy Barr slipped a large chicken head costume over Gil's head, and Gil good-naturedly danced with his hands in the air. Later, DG Gil and VDGs Ken Myers and Bob Susaeta donned large sombreros as they introduced themselves as the "Three Amigos."

Other highlights were the Youth Exchange students, the long line of First Timers, Seal Beach's Scott Newton receiving the LCI 50-member Grand Master Key Award, a slideshow showing activities around the district and the club announcements, which were kept to only future events so the clubs could support each other in their endeavors. An especially poignant moment was the hearty singing of the Governor's theme song, called "Lead, Grow and Serve" and sung to "The Saints Go Marching In." The song was written by Public Relations Chair Carol Van Holt before she fell seriously ill. Carol had so hoped to be well enough to attend the launching of the song, but instead, we all tried to sing loud enough for her to hear in the adjoining city! A final noteworthy recognition – the Costa Mesa Country Club outdid itself with the lunch, which included, among other items, delicious Chicken Cordon Bleu and rich chocolate mousse cake.



District 4-L4 Sight & Hearing Van

The first S&H van was designed and built in 1980 and over the years Lions have used it to help screen countless thousands of school children, homeless, and indigent members of our various communities. With the generous donations from many of our Lions Clubs we have been able to improve on our vision screening ability.

In the past year we have purchased and installed the following new equipment:

- **SLIT LAMP** an upright microscope used to view structures of the eye such as the cornea, iris and lens.
- AUTOREFRACTOR a device used during an eye exam to help determine visual acuity by examining how the eye processes light.
- **TONOMETER** used to check eye pressure, especially important for patients with a diagnosis of glaucoma.
- OPTHALMOSCOPE used for the examination of the retina, retina blood vessels, optic disc and fovea depression (small cavity in the eye).

This year, thanks to 4-L4 Lions Clubs' donations, we are adding PEDIA VISION CAMERAS which will allow us to screen children and adults at a rate of 1-2 minutes each.

The van is available to all 4-L4 Lions Clubs on a first come, first reserved basis. If the driver is a Lion, our insurance covers her or him. If we have sufficient notice, we can probably provide a driver and even optometrists.

#### MEMBERSHIP CHAIRMAN DAVE HUBBARD

ON MEMBERSHIP: SEIZE THE OPPORTUNITIES

In years past, many of our club grew in membership. They developed successful fundraisers and service projects. As time went on, they grew comfortable with their membership and projects and continued with them without any growth or development of new projects or fundraisers. With time, the members grew older and they began having problems continuing their projects. When asked, "Do you have any new and younger members?" the answer was "No. We're too old and tired to get new members. They don't want to join our club." Is this your club? The solution: Ask before it's too late.

Sometimes we get complacent about membership. We question the need for District officers to continually push membership. The answer is simple. Without new membership, we cannot continue to grow and thrive. Our clubs grow old and die. All we are asking is to "Just ask before it's too late". It's a lot easier to recruit new and younger members if you continually ask rather than wait until you are too old and tired to demonstrate a strong and viable club. Younger adults have different values and ideas that many older members and can turn around a club if given the opportunity. But, if the club is too set in their ways, they don't have the ability to encourage young adults to join and the club dies.

We've been encouraged by the news of a number of clubs increasing membership in the first month of the new Lions year. Congratulations to Huntington Beach Host, Mission Viejo, Seal Beach, and Laguna Niguel. I understand that La Habra Host, Orange and Placentia-Linda have prospective new members that will be joining in the next few weeks. These are clubs that have reported new members in advance of the end of the month MMRW's. Will your club join the list?

Have you lost members in the last 2 months? Did you try to get them to fill out an exit interview? This is a valuable tool in learning why they are leaving and what you could have or can do to retain them. If it is an issue of not paying dues, you might want to let them know that they can be reinstated without penalty if they pay this year's due. Why not retain them rather than lose them? It's harder to get new members than it is to retain old ones.
