# Lions Clubs International Convention Toronto, Canada July 4 to July 8, 2014

Six District 4-L4 Lions--2014-2015 DG Gil and Lion Barbara Smith, 2013-2014 DG Sheila and PDG Jon Casteel, 1VDG Ken Myers and Cucamonga District Host Lion Jerry McJunkin--flew to Toronto, where they were delegates for the Lions Clubs International Convention. Gil and Barbara flew in four days early for the District Governors-Elect Training and Adult Companions Meetings.

Spectacular as always, the Parade of Nations showcased Lions in native dress from nations around the world and from states in the United States as they walked, marched or danced through Toronto to the beat of bands. Immediately prior to the parade was the annual California Breakfast, where Lions ate heartily and listened to candidates.

Attendees learned the most current news about LCI events across the globe, paid tribute to a highly successful year under President Barry Palmer, celebrated with incoming President Joe Preston, and elected Bob Corlew as Second Vice President in a hotly contested race. Professionally, Corlew is (but soon will be retiring) the chancellor for the Sixteenth District Court in Tennessee. The new First Vice President is Dr. Jitsuhiro Yamada, a neurosurgeon from Japan. At the conclusion of the final session, about 750 District Governors were installed.

Entertainment was provided by Neil Sedaka (who, after all these years, is still an excellent singer and pianist), Olivia Newton–John, David Foster, and an incredibly talented teenaged vocalist, who is blind. Even President Preston entertained us on several occasions by singing and playing on a keyboard, in his Country Western style, two songs he had written for Lions. Especially impressive is his theme song, entitled "Strengthen the Pride."






## **Student Speaker Foundation**




#### ZONE C CHAIRMAN LINDSAY SAFE
