

### **CLFIS First Half Update**

In the first half of the Lions 2014/15 year, California Lions Friends in Sight Vision Screening Team continued their travels throughout Southern California and Northern Mexico providing free vision screenings and distributing free pairs of recycled eyeglasses to individuals who needed them. Over 5,300 people were provided with vision screenings with 84% of them receiving free recycled eyeglasses. Patient count is running about the same as last year, which was an all time record count.

Dr. Van Dusen had extra assistance this year at the Santa Ana vision screening from 4 Ophthalmologist students from the School of Optometry at UC Irvine. Special thanks go out to Drs. Bedrossian and Horner who assisted Dr. Van Dusen numerous times during the 16 vision screenings this past 6 months. Dr. Van Dusen always welcomes assistance from visiting local doctors from the communities where we are providing a vision screening that weekend. During a CLFIS vision screening every patient is seen by Dr. Van Dusen or one of his assisting optometrists or ophthalmologist to determine if they have any medical or surgical need. If they have a need, the individuals are advised of such and directed to seek care. During the 2014/15 Lions year first half 16 vision screenings 296 individuals had a medical or surgical need.

As has been pointed out previously, the team could not provide these vision screenings without the help of the many volunteers that come to help. These volunteers come from Lion Clubs representing numerous MD4 Districts across central and southern California. Additional volunteers come from Arizona, northern Mexico, several Leo Clubs, and many students from various Career Tech schools and non-Lions who wish to serve their community.




