Membership in the District continues to grow. We finished February at 1,313, which is a net +80 for the year. Great job, 4-L4 Lions! Clubs that had a net growth in February included: Huntington Beach Host, Laguna Niguel, Mission Viejo, Placentia Linda, and Seal Beach.

Every club with one or more new member this year is encouraged to immediately activate them by getting them involved with hands-on community service projects. This is the proven path to member satisfaction and retention. Thus far this year in 4-L4 we have gained 201 new members, but have lost 121.

California is also doing well with a net +215 for the year, which has moved MD4 into third position within Constitutional Area I (the United States) at 20,372 members. Seal Beach, with its 302 members, has now hit #2 in club size in the United States.



Orphanages of Thailand, Inc. By Lion John Doogan

We arrived in Wat Bot Thailand on Wednesday, 2/25 after a 20 hour flight and a 6-hour van ride driving 400 miles to North Central Thailand. This area is one of the poorest areas of the world visited by very few Westerners. Join me as I share with you some of the fascinating discoveries I made!

I was honored to distribute 131 scholarships to the children of Wat Bot. We were able to do this because of the generosity and hard-work of Lions and Leos in supporting the Children's Shelter.

The Children's Shelter of Wat Bot provides many significant contributions to the lives of these children and the entire community. The money donated for scholarships allows many hundreds of students to stay in school and continue their education. Our distribution center for clothing and food makes it possible for the poorest children to be confident in attending school.



We introduced the first computers to the schools of Wat Bot and provided training for the instructors to teach the students; this made them able to compete for college with the larger city schools. With the after school programs, students have a place to go to, when many of their homes have no adult supervision. Their families work in the rice fields from sunlight to midnight. The people of Wat Bot are very appreciative and thank me for the wonderful help provided by Americans and especially the Leos and Lions of California! The village is so proud of these children and what we have done, more than 900 villagers turned out for the scholarship ceremony.

I visited Wat Bot on Wednesday morning and was happy to see the Buddhist Temple, being built on the land of the shelter, has greatly progressed in it's construction since my visit May, 2014. Most of the money, materials and labor were donated by the villagers of Wat Bot with great sacrifice and devotion. Additional money and the land used to build the temple were donated by my family; no money was used by the Lions or Leos for this project.

The importance of the Temple being on the shelter's land is that it brings many resources to help the poor children of Wat Bot. The life of this community revolves around the Temple. The temple is built out of very special wood from trees that can only be cut down to build this very special Temple. The construction plans for the temple are over 600 years old and must be followed to the smallest detail.



There are no nails or screws used in construction. More than 200 hand-carved wooden panels, such as the one pictured, are displayed on the outside. North Central Thailand is so peaceful and it is the number one rice producing area in the world. The families of this area are steeped in family values and help each other, living the pure and simple values of Buddhism.

All who have entered this Temple have spoken of an incredible spirituality and peacefulness in this wonderful place of tranquility.

The head monk wanted to show me a very special corner of the Temple. There is a small alter dedicated to Saint Patrick. My wife told him that St. Patrick is my favorite saint and the patron saint of Ireland. I'm sure this is the only altar to St. Patrick in any Buddhist temple.




Diamond Bar Breakfast Lions - as reported by Lion Anne Sue
