This joint team was able to put glasses on 131 people and screened 160. The Lions were asked to assist with this health fair 4 weeks ago and the Lions came through. DISTRICT 4-L4 District Governor 1974-1975 Lyle Parks, Jr. 1936-2016

Governor Lyle Parks, Jr. was born April 21, 1936 in Wilmar, California. He graduated from Whittier High School in 1954 and Fullerton College in 1956. He passed away at home on March 27.

He was president of Lyle Parks, Jr., Inc. Lion Lyle has been self employed as a general contractor for 14 years and also owns and manages an industrial complex in La Habra.

Lion Lyle had been active in Lionism since he joined the La Habra Host Lions Club in 1961 serving as President 1964-65. In District 4-L4 Governor Lyle was the Region Chairman for Narcotics Prevention 1965-66, Region Chairman for Community Relations 1966-67, Zone "C" Chairman 1967-68, District Chairman for Leo Clubs 1968-69, served 4 years on MD4 Student Speakers Standing Committee, served as District Finance Chairman to elect Harry Aslan for 3rd Vice President of Lions Clubs International 1971-72, District Chairman Division of Regions 1972-73, District Membership and Retention Chairman 1973-7 4. Lion Lyle is a Key member

Active in community affairs with emphasis placed on youth, Governor Lyle was past president of the Associate Board of the La Habra Boys' Club and served on the Advisory Board of Directors of the La Habra Boys' Club. He also served as committee chairman for Cub Scout Pack 1296. Lion Lyle assisted in the organization and served on the board of directors of Hacienda Bank, La Habra.

PDG Lyle will be remembered and admired as a true servant leader by all who had the privilege and good fortune to know him.

SEAL BEACH: Once again the Seal Beach Lions were on hand on St. Patrick's Day on Main Street in Seal Beach to give people a ride home who had "imbibed" too much. This community project is supported by the SB Police Department, the City Council, and the local merchants.

They cooked two dinners at Ronald McDonald House – one for Orange and one for Long Beach.. Lions threw a baby shower for 13 female veterans at the Long Beach VA. Each mother got a \$150 gift certificate, target gift cards and diapers purchased with \$400 donated from SB Lions' pockets. Their LAG (Lions Against Graffiti) team removed 11 tags during March. They supported the Miss Seal Beach pageant through both a financial donation as well as manpower. Lion Rosie Ritchie is the pageant director. Other Lions used their skills to handle the photography, judging, publicity, contestant supervision and other pageant responsibilities.

The Seal Beach Lions Club declared March as Sight Month. They started promoting sight activities in mid-February and received 9 different articles covering 5 sight events: CLFIS Sight Screenings in Encinitas, Corona, and Mexicali; Dining in the Dark Fundraiser; Eyeglass Collection throughout the month. It ended with the Eyes Across California Sight rally setup at 8am and collecting eyeglasses until 3pm. They erected a 20x20 canopy by the pier and set up eyeglass sorting stations, an eyeglass collection mailbox, a static display of eyeglass prescription reading equipment and unique eyeglasses that have been collected. A prize wheel gave every donor the opportunity to win prizes with every donation. Most of the volunteers worked tirelessly throughout the day sorting a total of 7,481 eyeglasses. Others cooked food, worked the display tables, gave out prizes and collected glasses. They gave away tickets to two Lions pancake breakfasts, the Lions Fish Fry, new sunglasses, Lions cups & koozies, and candy. Lions Lee & Cassie Lindquist, Rose Marie Baker, Ray Longoria, Shani-rae Erickson spent a great deal of time collecting glasses at several other locations.

Eight new Lions attended a new member orientation conducted by Lion Scott Newton. Seven Lions served as Leo advisors at the Huntington Beach Crab Fest organizing the SB, VBA and Fountain Valley Leos who served as waiters. Seal Beach Lions supported the Police Foundation at their recent fundraiser and provided manpower at the March 10K run. They had 11 Lions participate in the Read Across America project reading to classrooms k-6 in honor of Dr. Seuss's birthday.

GARDEN GROVE: In February Garden Grove Lions generously funded over \$2,300 for eye exams and glasses for disadvantaged children in the GG Unified School District. In the fourth quarter of 2015 local optometrists gave eye exams to 28 disadvantaged children in need of vision care. The school nurses identified the students who were in need of eye care.

OC COSTA RICAN LIONS: The CRL held their first ever health fair on March 26! It was also officially our Zone B health fair. The club had reserved the eye mobile that was manned by students from the College of Optometry of Fullerton. They had music and food for the participants (which included community organizations for the Latino population), and screened approximately 45 persons. Another one is being planned for next year, and, with better advertising they will screen more people.

ANAHEIM LIONS: Meanwhile, and on Saturday the 26th it was literally at the same time, The Anaheim Lions held their famous H.S. Baseball Tournament. 82 teams played to participate, some came from Hawaii, some from back east, and then some came from Canada! This thing has become truly international in scope, to the point that College and professional scouts also attend. Way to go Anaheim for advertizing what is sadly a well kept secret: Lions clubs!

BUENA PARK: Lions held a garage sale in support of a team sponsorship of the American Cancer Society Relay for Life held in June. They had their annual pancake breakfast for the City sponsored Eggstravenganza held the day before Easter for the children of the surrounding area.

At the Zone level, we had our contest on March 8th in Fullerton with 3 clubs represented by very capable speakers (The clubs were Anaheim, Buena Park and Orange), unfortunately the Zone winner did not win the Region level, but Kudos anyway for Tiffany Minton. Hopefully you will go further next year.

FOOTHILL REGION REPORT CHAIRMAN MARTHA HEBERT

ZONE A Chair Steve Lacey:

<u>CUCAMONGA DISTICT HOST LIONS</u> – President Steve Lacey says the best news coming from Cucamonga District Host Lions is the impact of new members being added almost monthly. One of their most recent new member Denise just received her Proud Lions Award. Another new member Steve R. had the honor of being inducted by Gov. Ken who was visiting the club the day he was installed. Steve has already

agreed to accept a director position on this coming year's Board of Directors. The club expects their 50/50 ticket sales to jump now that one of their newest and most energetic members Ronnika has taken over that responsibility. It is going to be hard to say no to this new Lion. They even have a "soon-to-be-member" who was present at their Speakers Contest and was so impressed by it that she is talking about wanting to head up that event next year. 'New blood' is certainly making an impact with CDH Lions.

<u>ONTARIO UPLAND LIONS</u> - Elizabeth reports the club is still active with transporting elderly individuals to doctor's appointments, shopping and activities. They have members that help monthly with collecting and distributing food at a local area church. The club also has members that help collect and sort items for recycling. The club is in the planning stages for their annual tea.

<u>UPLAND HOST</u> – The club reports that they were invited to help man the Sight and Hearing Van at a Health Fair that was planned for April 2nd and 3rd at the Anaheim Convention Center. Lions Gov. Ken, Keith K. and Jim K have volunteered for the two days from 8:00 am – 4:00 pm and said that other volunteers are welcome. Upland Host Lion were also asked to volunteer to participate with the Upland Parks and Recreation in providing eye exams on Saturday May 7th. This club is also active in recycling market plastic bags into Bed Mat for local homeless and continues to be active with their local Boy Scout Troop.

ZONE B Chair Mike Shaw:

ONTARIO HOST - reports that they are proud to be able to provide some funding to purchase exercise equipment for FrontSight Military Outreach in Ontario, CA to support their mission which is "Our Objective is to Provide a Christ-Centered place where Veterans and their families can find camaraderie, trust, and healing for their visible and invisible wounds".

<u>POMONA HOST</u> - reports that five Lions continued to work on the Little Free Libraries – restocking the books at the laundromat library, Hope Partners Food Bank, and the women's shelter. Another member continues building the libraries. Two other Lions – the administration head and the president of the teacher's union agreed to give us additional storage upstairs so we can house all the restocking books at one location. Two Lions also made separate book donations, pick-ups and delivered them to the storage area. In March PH Lions donated \$1000 to LCIF for a Melvin Jones Fellow. Other donations for the month were to, Feeding the Homeless, Pomona Beautification, Flag Days, Braille Institute and District 4-L4 Sight and Hearing Foundation. Two Lions collected 45 ink and toner cartridges, We use the money toward our club's printing and paper cost, such as book plate labels for our Lions Roar Reading, Agendas, surveys, etc. Five PH Lions ran the Westmont Park portion of the city's Easter Egg Hunt. This year, hunts were run simultaneously at multiple parks throughout the city with different organizations in charge of each park. Hunts and games were run separately for different aged children with prizes for those who found the prize eggs. The club's giant bubble making was quite popular.

As a part of the LCI RAP partnership with RIF and Macy's the PH Lions distribute free books to first graders at schools with poverty rates (federal Free and Reduced Lunch criteria) of 95% and above. The Pomona Valley Hospital Medical Center is also donating books to the club, for both the Lions Roar for Reading and our Little Free Libraries. On Monday March 14, five lions distributed free books to first graders at Lopez Elementary School, the most poverty stricken school in the Pomona Unified School District. 97.3% of the students qualify for federal poverty guidelines. Most of the students have never owned a book prior to the Lions distribution. Tuesday was our largest distribution of the year with five first graduation classes and 139 students. Even more challenging, the principal asked to finish within 40 minutes, just before the awards assembly. To accomplish this, we had nine Lions arrange books on the table, replenish the books during the distribution and help the students make choices. Gratefully we finished just before the students started arriving in the cafeteria (where the distribution was) for the assembly. We finished packing our books as the students took their seat. Eighty five students in first grade classes at Madison School also received books. PH Lions had a very large Flag Day event for five classrooms simultaneously. Professor Bob taught the students patriotic sign language. They also had one prospective lion working on the project.

ZONE C Chair Sergio Gonzalez

<u>DIAMOND BAR BREAKFAST LIONS</u> – reported that they held their 33rd Annual Pancake Breakfast and Easter Egg hunt at Pantera Park, serving 9000 people.

WALNUT DIAMOND BAR LIONS - report that they collected 177 pairs of used eyeglasses from the Walnut Senior Center and Walnut High School. There was one Hearing Aide collected from the Walnut Senior Center. Walnut-Diamond Bar Lions hosted their annual Easter Egg Hunt and Pancake breakfast on the morning of March 26 at Walnut Ranch Park. Approximately 90 were served breakfast (pancakes, eggs and sausage with coffee and punch) while approximately 300 children participated in the egg hunt. Plastic eggs were turned in to the group of nine Leo assistants for bags of candy or toothbrush kits. Some eggs were specially marked for a prize of a silver dollar coin donated by Lion Jerry Heffern.




