One of the best parts of being a Lion is serving our local communities as well as meeting worldwide humanitarian needs. Club secretaries are asked to report the club's service activities as they occur. Service activity reporting helps us measure the impact of our service and helps our leaders at the District, Multiple District and International levels understand the needs and interests of the local club and provides a searchable record of the year's activities. Clicking the "Share Button" helps inspire fellow Lions with our success stories that may be shared in the Lions Magazine and searched for by other clubs and districts worldwide. LCI uses the data Lions provide to track progress made towards this goal and to recognize Lions who participate. The data will also be used to demonstrate Lions' commitment and contribution to the global sustainable development agenda to partner organizations, such as the United Nations and World Health Organization and other groups that LCI obtains grants from.

Their members will provide a wrapped present to each student at that school which will be delivered by a very happy Santa and a helpful elf. After two moving, heartwarming and inspirational military speakers, the <u>Ontario Host Lions</u> were honored at the 2nd District Meeting by receiving the "Club Excellence Award for 2015-2016." The <u>Pomona Host Lions Club</u> has again had a busy month of service. It completed a highly successful food drive at Albertson's with the food and money going to God's Pantry (part of the school district's Family Support and Resource Center). Shoppers bought 91 bags of groceries for the needy and also donated \$314 in cash. Members are also cooking turkeys and serving the homeless at Thanksgiving. Currently, the club is preparing for its series of Feeding the Homeless dinners twice a month at the Winter Homeless Shelter. The Lions' Santa Cop Toy Drive was launched and will continue through December. The toys are given to needy children at a holiday party, sponsored by the Pomona Police Department. The annual Sight for Success fundraising campaign was also kicked off. For \$50, a sponsor can purchase a pair of eyeglasses for a child who otherwise cannot afford vision care. The Lions Roar for Reading project is reviving up with all books having been selected and purchased. The club soon will be holding distributions of books to the first graders at the nine elementary schools with over 95% of their families living in poverty. For most of the children, the Lions' gift will be the first book that they actually own. The club's other major literacy project, its Little Free Libraries, continues to be very active. Thank you to the District Lions who donated books! During November, the club installed another Little Free Library at a laundromat. Finally this month, the club continues to collect eyeglasses, made a donation to Guide Dogs for the Blind, made visitations to the Harbor Mesa and Upland Host Lions, had two excellent programs (one by Lion Scott Quinlan on Guide Dogs for the Blind and the other by Lion Denny Mosier on the Do's and Don'ts of Making Presentations), supported a Boys' and Girls' Club fundraising dinner, and filled a table at the second District Meeting.
