The Foundation Bylaws have been updated, as well as the Hearing Aid Manual and the Van Manual, thanks to Lion Al Hahn, Lion Gary Denni and Lion Randy McMillian. The Van and Hearing Aid Manuals, as well as the bylaws will be uploaded to the District Web Site this month.

We are purchasing a DVD player with a screen, so that all can view the DVD that shows how to use and operate the van with less confusion. #### ADVENTURES IN YEP Lynn Davis

If I had any idea what hosting youth from other countries via the Lions Youth Exchange Program was going to do for my family and me, I would have joined Lions years earlier just to participate. As it was, it was not until 2011 that I put my hand up and said that my wife and I would consider hosting a student. Because our son, Peter, would be home from his first year at college, we decided upon a young man from Denmark who was Peter's age. At the time, I had little idea what to expect. Would we have two awkward weeks of trying to understand his English? Was he only here to have an exciting summer break, would he even remember us after he was back at home?

Christian Möller of Odense, Denmark showed up at our house, and our lives have never been the same. Did he understand our English? Absolutely - and he could make up his own on-the-fly jokes in the English language! Did we have any common interests? He is very interested in economics, politics and adventure literature. Would he remember us? Five years later, when we invited him here for a trip to celebrate a milestone in his life, he told us that he also wanted to return once he had children of his own so they could meet his "California parents."

Christian was eighteen and worked as an all-night bartender, yet had no problem obeying California's drinking age while he was here. His twin brother was headed to the Danish version of West Point, and he would himself end up not only going through basic military training, but remaining nearly three years - ending up as a Sergeant before heading to law school. And he kept in touch, sent notes and photos and so did we. We agonized when his military unit was scheduled for Afghanistan, and celebrated when his government withdrew when Kabul politicians were less than welcoming to their troops.

Last October, Denmark became the first country in Europe that Brenda and I ever visited. Christian handled every detail. We met his lovely girlfriend Sara, his grandparents and mother. He drove five hours round trip to pick us up, not risking any mishap to us. He showed us castles, ancient Viking burial grounds and remains of ships, Danish food of all types, told us all about Hans Christian Andersen, and lots more! We saw the law firm where he now works, as well as smaller fishing villages on the island of Fyn. But all he did for us, and all we do for him, is really just a symbol of the affection we have gained for each other. When he first came here, we gave him a plastic "Viking helmet" as a joke, and he wore it in good humor. My son called him a "Denmarkian" which he also accepted without complaint. (They call themselves Dansk.) Christian towers over me, and I had an odd feeling as we visited Viking sites in Denmark and learned of their violent habits, to consider that the Viking descendent with me is one of the kindest people I know.

And he was the first of now seven and soon nine young men we have hosted and from whom we have learned and experienced many adventures and points of view. If you get a chance to host for YEP, don't miss out!

## PEACE POSTER CONTEST CHAIRPERSON Marianne Allen

This year the theme of the Lions International Peace Poster Contest is "A CELEBRATION OF PEACE." Young people-ages 11, 12 and 13 by November 15, 2016 are eligible to participate in the contest which is an opportunity for our youth to express their visions of peace through art.

Lions clubs around the world proudly sponsor the contest in local schools and youth groups. Participants can use a variety of mediums, including charcoal, crayon, pencil and paint, to express their vision of peace. (No computer generated art is allowed). The works vary greatly and reflect the young artists' life experiences and culture.

Clubs must order their contest kits by October 1, 2016 through International. The cost per kit is \$11.95. You must purchase a kit for each school or youth group which is participating. You can order kits from Club Supplies Sales Department at (630)571-5466 or you can order kits on line.

Club entries must be brought to the 2<sup>nd</sup> District meeting on November 19, 2016 for judging. Please make sure that you follow the directions for labeling each poster entry. The winner will be sent on to the next level which will be the MD4 contest. The deadline for the District Governor to submit one winning entry is December 1, 2016. The Multiple District winner must be submitted to the Public Relations Department of Lions Club International by December 15, 2016. The winner will be notified on or before February 2, 2017.

The winning poster will receive a cash award of \$5,000 and a trip to a special award ceremony. There will also be twenty three merit winners. They will receive a cash award of \$500 and a certificate of achievement.

## FOUR GENERATIONS OF SELTERS FAMILY IN POMONA HOST LIONS Barbara E. Smith, Secretary, Pomona Host Lions





The Pomona Host Lions just celebrated a once-in-a-lifetime...or perhaps it is a once-in-four-lifetimes event. When Clark Selters was inducted into Lions on May 19th, he became the fourth generation in his family to join the Pomona Host Lions Club. His great grandfather John B. Selters was active in the early years of the club until his death in 1947 and helped found the Los Angeles County Fair, which started as a Pomona Lions project. His grandfather John B. Selters, Jr. was a Lion from 1952 until his death in 2009, reaching 57 years of perfect attendance. Clark's father John B. Selters II (Ben) has been president twice, has 29 years of perfect attendance, and is a Melvin Jones Fellow. All four generations of Selters have practiced law in Pomona.

Lion Clark says that he joined Lions for several reasons. He had grown up with Lions service in his family so while in undergraduate college, he gravitated toward service leadership positions. Then after he graduated from law school and joined the family law firm, he felt "it was time to get back into community service." Another reason Clark gives for joining is "the history of my family in the Lions club." "Growing up with Lionism around me, I've known for a long time that this club was a great opportunity for service in this community."

Some of Clark's earliest childhood memories include 3-Selters-generations going to Lions activities together, such as the LCI Convention in Minneapolis, Minnesota, Lions Christmas parties and barbecues, club meetings and the club's Bowl-a-Thon, where he won a trophy in the kids' division. He has especially fond memories of his grandfather's gold vest and cap, which were always kept handy around the house or in the car.

This has been a time of new chapters in Lion Clark's life—graduating from law school, beginning work at the family firm, joining Lions, starting his first Lions' project as steward of the club's Little Free Library at Washington Park and then on June 17th, marrying his sweetheart Elizabeth.

Having the Selters family pass down a passion for Lions' service for four generations has truly been an inspiration for all of us in the Pomona Host Lions. We don't know if four generations of Lions from the same club is a world record, but we certainly feel that the Selters's longevity of passion for Lionism should be emulated throughout the world.


#### BLIND ETIQUETTE: SIX WAYS TO BE GRACIOUS AROUND PEOPLE WITH VISUAL IMPAIRMENTS

There's no "secret" to interacting with people who are blind. They just want to be treated like everybody else, with courtesy and respect. So relax and act naturally. Just be considerate of the fact that you can see and they cannot. Here are six suggestions that will make your next interaction with someone who is blind easier and more comfortable:

- 1. If you think someone who is blind may need help navigating, ask first. It's jarring for anyone to be unexpectedly grabbed or pulled, but especially so for someone who can't see who's doing the grabbing. By asking, you give the person a chance to say "yes please" or "no thank you."
- 2. **If your help is accepted, allow him or her to grasp your arm just above the elbow.** That makes it easier for the person to feel your movements and follow on their own terms.
- 3. If you see someone who is blind or visually impaired about to encounter danger, be calm and clear when you warn the person. Use specific language such as "there's a curb right in front of you" or "the door in front of you is closed" instead of "watch out!" Also, use directional language such as "to your left" or "directly behind you" rather than "it's over here." Think about what information you would want to know if you couldn't see.
- 4. **Identify yourself when approaching someone who is blind, or when entering a room with them.** Even if the person has met you before, he or she may not recognize you by your voice. In a group setting, address the person by name so they know when you're talking to them. And inform the person when you depart, so they don't continue the conversation to an empty room.
- 5. **Don't pet or distract a working guide dog.** These dogs are busy directing their owners and keeping them safe. Distracting them makes them less effective and can put their owners in danger.
- 6. **Use "people first" language.** No one wants to be labeled by how they are different. It's kinder, and more accurate, to say "a person who is blind" rather than "a blind person." We are all people first.

A little understanding and sensitivity goes a long way. By following these suggestions, you'll find that making a human connection is easy. It doesn't matter if one person can see and the other can't.

#### 2015/2016 ZONE B Chair Cathy Waters


