## *A Message from District Governor Ken Myers*

We are still a district in good standings with LCI. As of February 29<sup>th</sup> we have 1,295 members with a drop of 25 members and added 10 new members last month, so are at a net gain/loss of -15. With this decline and some clubs having concerns among their members, I know we can improve on this. We must remember that we are **all volunteers on the same team with the same goals "we serve"**.

First we must work together in our clubs to achieve our goals. With all the difference personalities and ways to achieve these goals we need to listen to each other's ideas then come together as one with a plan. Also if you have a concern about someone, go to that person first and talk to them before you go to others. When you hear something from another member get the facts first before you talk to others. Please review our code of ethics from time to time and remember why we are lions. Our district is still one of the best in MD4 in projects, activities, donations to LCIF, Leo's, Campus and student members.

The convention is near. We still need talent for the untalented talent show. Contact PDG Sheila Casteel if you would like to participate. I was asked a few questions about the convention. The only difference in this joint convention is that that the activities and meals are shared with District 4-L5. Each District will have their own business sessions on Friday afternoon and the two on Saturday.

Also new is when you vote there will be a yes box and a no box on the ballot of all items to be voted on. You must answer yes or no on all Candidates running for office even if it is only one person. If you do not mark a box your ballot will not be counted. All items voted must pass by majority (50+1) voters to win. If a Candidate does not get the majority votes then that position will be vacant.

Next month we will be holding our last District Meeting soon to be followed by our District Convention in San Diego. I hope that you will all make an effort to attend both of these events in support of Governor Ken and show how much we appreciated his leadership for the year.

Let me share the up to date figures with you for this month. Total membership is at 1,295  
Good news: we added 181 members this year. Sad news: we dropped 171.  
For a net gain of 10 members.

International President Yamada wrote recently that membership growth doesn't just lead to healthier clubs. It leads to healthier communities. On average, each Lion serves 50 people a year. He continues. Just imagine how many more lives your clubs can change when Lions invite new members to join them.

As the numbers above show, we are losing many members and in most cases really don't know why. In the LCI publication MEMBERSHIP SATISFACTION GUIDE on the very last page you will find the FORMER MEMBER QUESTIONNAIRE. This has 8 simple questions to ask the leaving member. I encourage your clubs to fill this out and forward it to the District GMT. If all clubs would do this perhaps we could see a pattern that could help all of us in understand why and also help us all in retaining members. Please give it a try and let's see where it takes us.

She set up a Rain Day Watershed Fair with interactive activities about local watersheds, river ecology pollution, river safety and watershed-based science education.

A number of SB Lions participated in the Seal Beach Naval Weapons Station Captain's Cup challenge. Members cooked breakfast for the local Cub Scouts during their recent pinewood derby. They also cooked hot dogs for the local Pony League baseball opening day. They participated in three California Lions Friends in Sight eye screenings and made dinner at the Orange Ronald McDonald House. They also donated \$2000 to the Seal Beach Lifeguards to purchase a new trailer for their dory.



Seal Beach Lion Adriana Ziegenbusch was named Queen of Hearts for the Los Alamitos Education Foundation where over 40 Lions showed their support by attending their awards dinner. Lion Adriana raised an impressive \$23,000 for LAEF.

## ***FOOTHILL REGION REPORT CHAIRMAN MARTHA HEBERT***

### **ZONE A Chair Steve Lacey**

CUCAMONGA DISTRICT HOST LIONS – President Steve Lacey says the best news coming from Cucamonga District Host Lions is the impact of new members being added almost monthly. Their most recent new member, Denise, has received her Proud Lions Award. Congratulations, Denise.

ONTARIO UPLAND LIONS members wrapped utensils to use to feed 106 homeless people, and made breakfast bags for the homeless to take with them. They prepared 240 food packets for the homeless in their area. Some members collected and sorted clothes for the homeless and donated the clothes to New Hope. There were members that assisted the elderly and transported elderly to Dr. appointments, shopping or home from hospital. Other members sorted and distributed food to 160 low income residents in the area. One member coached a student for the Student Speaker Contest for the Zone A competition after winning at the club level. There was a member who volunteered at church setting up for a Bible Study followed by a potluck luncheon, serving 28 people.

UPLAND HOST donated funds to provide ten new blankets for the needy through the Upland Christian Church. Three members spent 18 hours to continue their recycle program of plastic market bags to make bed mats for the homeless people in the Upland area. Two members provided eye exams and glasses to new classes at the Upland Elementary Schools in Upland. Two Lions assisted the Boy Scouts in a cleanup activity at the Upland Chaffey Community Center. One member collected 205 pairs of used eyeglasses.

### **ZONE B Chair Mike Shaw**

ONTARIO HOST has had a very eventful month with their Student Speaker Contest and several projects in the works for the Legacy program. Funds were donated to go toward a trailer to a local organization that helps Veterans move from place to place and gym equipment for another group to help with their physical rehabilitation. The club will be placing signs on the trailer and facilities to raise community awareness not only for their club but to the needs of our Veterans. The club is continuing to honor local high school students with lunch at a special club meeting to recognize their scholastic accomplishments. This recognition leads to presenting each recipient with a certificate and a check for \$25.00. This program was started by PCC Ed Bordenkircher years ago and has put our name out to the Ontario Academic Community while serving the five schools in our area. On Friday, February 19, Flag Day was observed at Lincoln Elementary School in Ontario.

POMONA HOST Recycling Chair collect 120 pairs of used eyeglasses from various locations to be shipped to Lions In Sight. Feeding the homeless men and women in the Pomona at the Winter Shelter took place on February 1st and 9<sup>th</sup>. Nine Lions, 3 Leos and a spouse purchased the ingredients, cooked the food and served a hot meal to 120 people. Throughout the month Lions have restocked the Little Free Library, planned future development of libraries, sorted books, etc. Laundromat patrons read the books while doing laundry and borrow them to finish reading. The books were given to free food recipients at the Hope Partners Food Bank. Lions Libraries were in high demand. This month 190 books were put in the libraries. Seventeen books are being donated to the babies of local teen mothers by the Generation Her Teen Mother Baby Level Book program in town. It is our hope to begin the literacy process from birth.

The club held a Clothing Drive Fundraiser where club members donated hundreds of items of used clothing to be turned in for money to go toward the Administrative funds. Charities Bowl-A-Thon is Pomona Host's signature fundraiser raised \$234 for their community service projects, such as eyeglasses for needy school children, many grants for classroom instructional enrichment, feeding the homeless, Flag Day Books, youth activities, Kindles for the hospital, Braille Institute bus transportation, etc. Members have made generous monetary donations for their clubs charities work in the amount of \$800. In January and February we continued collecting pledges making the total now \$6,346. As part of LCI Roar for Reading (Preparation) Partnership with RIF and Macy's the Pomona Host Lions distributed free books to first graders at school with poverty rate (federal free or reduced lunch criteria of 95% and above). The preparation process continues with accumulating books, and meeting with the committee members. On Wednesday, February 23, two Lions sorted through books given to the club by Pomona Valley Medical Center. These books will be added to the Lions Roar for Reading first grade book distribution.

POMONA HOST Recently inventoried the books received from Macy's. Lions labels were placed in each book and divided the books into class sets, with extra books in each set allowing for all students to make a selection. The club has been working with the school district to arrange a time to distribute the books to first graders in at least five schools.

For Flag Day, throughout the year club members visit second grade classes in PUSD where they read aloud patriotic book on our flag, often teaching the students sign language and each student a small flag on a custom made wood stand with Patriotic label. The Lions then leave the book for the class library and a stuffed lion dressed in patriotic garb is given to the teacher for the class.

Five students from each of the high schools competed in PHL's Student Speaker Contest. Lion Morgan Brown, Executive Director of the Teacher's Union coordinated with the schools and planned the event. Lion Frank Guzman, Pomona Unified School District Board Member, moderated the event and presented. The winner was Robert Rodriguez. Each speakers was presented with a check.

#### **ZONE C** Chair Sergio Gonzalez

DIAMOND BAR BREAKFAST LIONS members held two hospitality, one at Blaisdale Park in Claremont for 83 people and the other at OLA in Claremont for fourteen people. On February 15, the club held it Student Speaker Contest with three contestants from Diamond Bar High School Leo Club. The winner was James English and will go on to Zone C level on Monday, March 7<sup>th</sup> at South Coast AQMD at 7:00 pm.

On February 14, 2016 Miss Diamond Bar Pageant held their annual fashion show at Mountain Meadows Golf Course in Pomona, as Diamond Bar Golf Course was having some remodeling done. To celebrate Black History Month, Principal Cynthia Sanchez of Armstrong Elementary School invited former Principal, Lion Cindee Quan to the students presentation of a wonderful Living Museum. Thanks to Lions Sergio Gonzalez, Susanne Jones, Anne Sue, Debbie Avula- Mott and George Wong for attending.

WALNUT DIAMOND BAR LIONS held their Student Speaker Contest on Thursday, February 4, 2016 at Walnut City Hall, Council Chambers. The winner was Viraj Dhillon from Walnut High School. Viraj will go on to compete in the Zone C level on Monday, March 7.
