

# **Become a Founding Member of the California Lions Foundation**

The new California Lions Foundation (CLF) has been approved by the IRS and State of California as a non-profit, tax-exempt, 501(c)(3) corporation for the purpose of providing assistance to California Lion clubs! This new foundation will provide matching grants from \$500 - \$10,000 to California Lions clubs for projects that do not qualify for support from any existing Lions foundation.

In order to begin assisting Lions clubs, we have established an initial funding goal of \$250,000. In order to meet this goal, CLF is providing an opportunity to California Lions and California Lions clubs to become 'Founding members' and 'Founding clubs' of the Foundation through calendar year 2017. Lions may become a 'Founding Member' of CLF for a donation of \$1,000, in addition the member will be also receive recognition as a 'Kay Fukushima Fellow'. California Lions Clubs may become a 'Founding Club' of CLF for a donation of \$5,000. Founding member donations by individual Lions may be counted toward the 'Founding Club' donation amount to qualify as a 'Founding Lions club'.

By becoming a CLF 'Founding Member' you will be helping California Lions make a difference in their communities. Again, funds donated to CLF will remain in California to assist California Lions. 

As the dust settles from the high-water mark of service to our communities during the holidays, we soon will be getting back to our regular schedules. The Ontario-Host Lions Club will be looking for service projects to start for the upcoming months. Lion Mike Shaw gave the Community Needs Assessment booklet to members in the community to complete for ideas on new projects. While Ontario-Host members wait to start something new, they will continue working on established projects. In February, they will hold their annual Outback fundraiser for members/guests and a special "Flag Day" celebration for the elementary schools in Ontario. In March, they will be working alongside the Ontario Chamber to put up more military banners on the streets of Ontario. In April and May, the club will be working on its last environmental patch. On June 15<sup>th</sup> they will be holding their annual golf tournament at Sierra La Verne County Club to help raise money for these projects. On Saturday, January 14<sup>th</sup>, Valerie Wells, Michael Shaw, Debbi Nichols, Valerie Johnson and John Garbo (not shown) from the Ontario-Host Lions were honored with the prestigious Melvin Jones award for their tireless service and charity work in their community. They were all very proud and honored to be chosen by their club. As Lions, we are willing to fill needs whenever and however we can...but not everyone sees service and charity as the Lions!

Story of the Day

A local charity had never received a donation from the town's banker, so the director made a phone call.

"Our records show you make \$500,000 a year, yet you haven't given a penny to charity," the director began. "Wouldn't you like to help the community?"

The banker replied, "Did your research show that my mother is ill, with extremely expensive medical bills?"

"Um, no," mumbled the director.

"Or that my brother is blind and unemployed? Or that my sister's husband died, leaving her broke with four kids?

"I ... I ... I had no idea."

"So," said the banker, "if I don't give them any money, why would I give any to you?"

In January the <u>Pomona Host Lions</u> immersed themselves in feeding the homeless at the winter shelter. Twice they planned menus, shopped for groceries, cooked and served meals to approximately 150 homeless men and women on each of the two nights. Little Free Libraries stewards and transporters kept busy restocking libraries throughout town, collecting used books and driving them to the storage room. Several members helped at the Garden Grove Food Bank project, and Lions Roar for Reading committee members are gearing up for book distributions to first graders at nine schools. It also continued collecting eyeglasses. At the first general membership meeting, members heard several speakers on "Seniors and Mental Health," and at the second meeting, they were enthralled by one of the club's own Lions, Past President Professor Yehia Mortagy, who just returned from a sabbatical in Egypt. He shared his candid observations about what is happening in Egypt and in the surrounding area. The club added a new member, a young optometrist, to the club.

### **FOOTHILL ZONE C CHAIR DAVE STILWELL**

The <u>Chino Valley Lions</u> collected 161 pairs of eyeglasses for California Lions Friends in Sight and four hearing aids which will be given to District 4-L4 Hearing Aid Bank Program. Lou Alfonso collected food from local markets and the food was given to the local food bank for distribution to those in need. A donation of \$500 was made to a local charity, Isaiah's Rock, who helps community members who need help and with local food distribution. The <u>Walnut Lions</u> collected 29 pair of eyeglasses from Walnut Senior Center and Walnut High School. The <u>Diamond Bar Breakfast Lions</u> are preparing for their fundraising event, the "Drumming for Kids" concert on Sunday, February 12th at Diamond Bar High School Theater from 2pm-5pm.
