## PEACE POSTER CONTEST UPDATE

This year the theme of the Lions Clubs International Peace Poster Contest is "THE FUTURE OF PEACE." The purpose of the contest is to encourage our young people to express their visions of peace through art. Lions clubs around the world proudly sponsor the contest in local schools and youth groups. Young people ages 11, 12, and 13 (by November 15, 2017) are eligible to participate in the contest. Participants can use a variety of mediums including charcoal, crayon, pencil and paint (No computer art is allowed). The works vary greatly and reflect the young artists' life experiences and culture. Clubs must order their contest kits by October 1, 2017 through LCI. The cost per kit is \$11.95. You must purchase a kit for each school or youth group participating. You can order kits from the Club Supplies Sales Department at (630)571-5466 or you can order kits on line. Club entries must be brought to the 2<sup>nd</sup> District Meeting on November 18<sup>th</sup> for judging. Please make sure that you follow the directions for labeling each poster entry. The winner will be sent on to the next level which will be the MD4 contest. The deadline for the District Governor to submit one winning entry is December 1<sup>st</sup>. The Multiple District winner must be submitted to the LCI Public Relations Department by December 15<sup>th</sup>. The winner will be notified on or before February 2, 2018. The creator of the winning poster will receive a cash award of \$5,000 and a trip to a special award ceremony. There will also be 23 merit winners. They will receive a cash award of \$500 and a certificate of achievement. 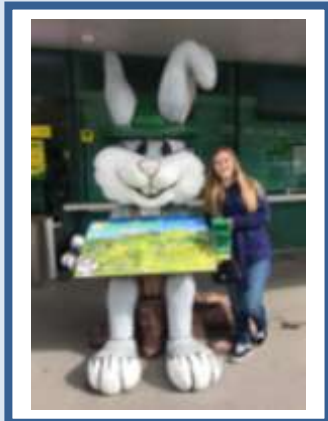

In addition to her service through Lions, WendyAnn teaches ESL on a volunteer basis and has been to Kenya serving children in the slums of Nairobi and Turkana and has been to Honduras to serve the language-deprived deaf. WendyAnn strongly believes in her motto, "Let us not grow weary of doing good."

June has been filled with end-of-year and beginning-of-year activities as well as some community service activities for the **Pomona Host Lions**. One of the most exciting events was the city-wide Trivia Bee, where our **Pomona Host Lions** advanced to the final round and then pulled off a resounding first place victory. Congratulations to Team Lions: Frank Alvarez, Glenda Ferguson and Dr. Bob Schoenberg. Sixteen Pomona Host cheerleaders were in the audience screaming for our three-person team, which was sitting on the stage. Our **Pomona Host Lions** members continue to take care of and restock books in all our Little Free Libraries. Some of the LFLs needed refurbishing so Lions took out paint brushes and building supplies to spruce up our book structures. In addition to our six registered LFLs and several mini-libraries, we have added a book collection at the year-round homeless shelter. Continuing its commitment to help eliminate hunger, the **Pomona Host Lions Club** has expanded its Feeding the Homeless program to year-round to match the new year-round schedule of the Pomona Homeless Shelter. At least once a month, our members cook and serve meals for up to 150 homeless men and women. Another focus of our club, in addition to literacy and hunger, is vision. As they do every month, club members collected used eyeglasses from the repositories throughout the city and the school district. Also, our **Pomona Host Lions** paid for eye exams and glasses for low-income students, who are seen at our Pomona Lions Vision and Hearing Center. 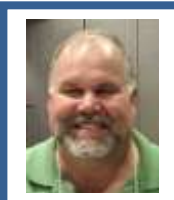
### WELCOME 2017-2018 SADDLEBACK REGION CHAIR JOHN ULRICH

### WELCOME 2017-2018 SADDLEBACK REGION ZONE A CHAIR SCOTT QUINLAN



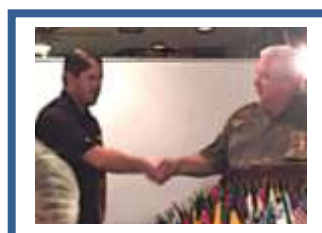
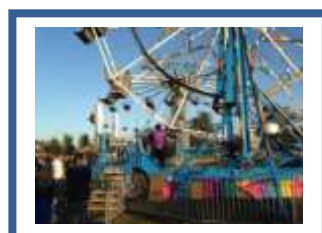

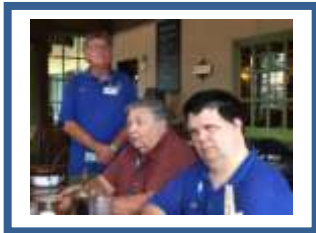
### 2016-2017 ZONE A WRAP-UP BY MARK PIVA
