

Fellow Lions of 4-L4,

We are pleased to continue the roll out of our new California Lions Foundation (CLF), which was approved last year by the MD4 Council of Governors, the IRS and State of California authorities as a non-profit, tax-exempt, IRC 501(c)(3) corporation for the purpose of providing assistance to California Lion Clubs.

Lions clubs may become a founding member of CLF with a donation of \$5,000, and in addition up to five members may receive recognition as a 'Kay Fukushima Fellow'. Founding member donations by individual Lions of \$1,000 may be counted toward the founding club donation amount to qualify as a founding club of CLF.

As you establish your charities budget for the next Lions year, supporting your new California Lions Foundation as founding member or club would be an outstanding choice! You will be helping California Lions make a difference in their communities. Again, funds donated to CLF will remain in California to assist California Lions. HIGHLIGHTS FROM DISTRICT LEOS FOR 2016-2017

This has been an exciting year for the Leo Clubs in the District!! It has also been a learning curve for me as the new Leo District Advisor/Chairman, but I have loved every minute of the ride! Our Leo District has added 4 new Leo Clubs: Garden Grove High School Leo Club sponsored by Garden Grove Lions Club, Chino High School Leo Club joint sponsored by Ontario and Upland Lions Cubs, Diamond Bar Community Leo Club sponsored by Diamond Bar Breakfast Lions Club and Cypress High School Leo Club sponsored by Seal Beach Lions Club. Welcome to the District!!! It is so great to see all the new clubs! We are now up to 30 Leo Clubs in our District. I have heard rumors that there are even more clubs waiting to join our numbers next year and we are looking forward to having them join us!

Some of our highlights this year have included our Leo Officer Training Seminar in October which was attended by 90 Leos. We even had an Austrian Leo join our meeting to see what we do. Everyone went away making new friends and getting to know more about their leadership positions. Next year we will have another seminar in September and we plan to have even more Leos involved. In addition to our local leadership training, we had several Leo Clubs that went to Teresita Pines for the Leadership Institute in April. Leos there interacted with other Leos across California. It is such a good experience for the Leos and for the advisors as well since all of us learned new ideas to better our clubs and made new friends. I am hoping we will have even more 4-L4 Leos attend next year! Some of the clubs represented at camp from 4-L4 were Chaffey High School Leo Club, Chino High School Leo Club, Seal Beach Leo Club, VBA Leo Club, and The Youth Center Leo Club. I hope I haven't forgotten anyone.

In our quarterly meetings, we have focused on helping the individual Leo clubs to be successful in their own communities. We did this by having the Leos break into discussion groups to get to know others in the District, to ask questions of each other, and to share successful projects as well as ask for help with how to complete projects. We also had a time for Leos to participate in a service project, like make supply bags for homeless people out of a t-shirt, so they could take it back to their clubs and replicate the project. In addition, we had Leos brainstorm to come up with specific projects so they could take them back to their clubs. At every meeting, we added in a lighter note of some ice breaker games and activities to get the young blood flowing. Of course, we can't overlook the wonderful goodies Lion Cindee Quan always showed up with. All in all, we had a great time at our District Meetings and many Leos chose to attend. We are looking to have more of the same next year, to improve upon what we did, and to get even more Leo Clubs involved.

This year, we challenged the Leo Clubs to join the Centennial Challenge of doing one service project in each of the following areas: hunger, sight, children, and environment. We had six clubs that completed activities in all of the categories: Aliso Niguel Leo Club, Diamond Bar High School Leo Club, Diamond Bar Community Leo Club, Lorbeer Leo Club, Seal Beach Leo Club, and Village Bible Academy (VBA) Leo Club. Congratulations! At the end of the year, we had special awards which were presented. First of all, we had the club of the year awards which were presented for number of projects completed, number of service hours, working with other Leo Clubs both with the sponsoring Lions Club and Leos from other Lions Clubs, and centennial projects completed. Since there is a big discrepancy in club size, we divided the clubs into small clubs for up to 29 Leos, medium had 30-69 members, and large clubs were for 70 Leos and above. The Small Leo Club of the Year was awarded to University HS Leo Club sponsored by Harbor Mesa Lions Club, Medium Leo Club of the Year was awarded to VBA Leo Club sponsored by Seal Beach Lions Club, and the Large Leo Club of the Year was awarded to Seal Beach Leo Club sponsored by Seal Beach Lions Club. The 2016-2017 4-L4 Leo of the Year was awarded to Sarina Kotowitz from Aliso Niguel High School Leo Club. The award was presented at the 4-L4 Lions District Convention to the Leo Club Advisor. I would be remiss if I didn't mention that the 2015-2016 4-L4 Leo of the Year Madison Berry went on to become the 2017 MD4 Leo of the Year. We will hear in July if Miss Berry had been awarded the International Leo of the Year award. Keep your eyes open for more news on this one!

Lastly, I want to give a big thank you to some special people. I couldn't have done this without the help from the associate District Advisors, Cindee Quan, John Doogan, and Marc Poli. I know what cancer and treatment can do to a body and I sometimes wonder if the treatment is worth it in the long haul. It seems to do more harm than good. Nothing is more painful than trying to smile and remain positive, but after chemo and radiation, you know the person is physically changed and they suffer with this sadness.

I honor those that ended their own battle in different ways. Some we sadly lost, yet others remain. Some have deep physical or emotional scars while others have survived so long they barely think of it. No matter how bad a situation is, there is another that has it worse. Many are battling right now and find it so difficult to answer "How are you doing?" The individual fighting cancer is in pain and misery, but fights emotionally to stay positive and strong. Many times I downplayed the pain in my body and heart to fight. Other times I drew strength from God and close loved ones to get by another five minutes. Many told me that I never lost my sense of humor and that my spirit stayed strong. All I can say to that is, "yeah right." My mind, body, and spirit were severely compromised. Only through careful, peaceful reflection and prayer did I feel stronger. Sometimes it was only a few minutes, but sometimes, that is what I needed.

Lions came through in amazing ways. Vickie and Drew Sasser organized a blood drive at City of Hope while I was there getting treatment. Many of the donations made that day went right upstairs into my veins, saving my life. All of the Lions that were able to donate made a difference that day, if not to me then to someone else battling cancer. Governor Bob and the rest of Cabinet constantly checked on me, offered encouragement and prayed for me. My own club did everything they could with Tamara and Steve constantly checking in and sending love and prayers.

You all joined hands in service to help and encourage me, exemplifying the nature of service and what it really means to be a Lion. Being a Lion means you have people in your corner that know exactly what you are feeling, and will do whatever they can to help and be there to cry with you. I knew I was not alone. I drew strength from Lions and their dedication.

Thank you for thinking of and praying for me when I was at my worst. Thank you for so much support and prayers during such a difficult time.




