

Our final District Meeting for the year was held on April 22nd. What a great and inspiring meeting that was, very well attended. The Student Speaker contestants were terrific – believe me it was much easier to be the Governor than one of the judges. Thank you, Lion Diane Quinlan, for standing in for Lion Scott. Congratulations to the individuals and clubs that received certificates and awards at the meeting from the MD4 Academy Awards at the MD4 Convention. Out of seven categories L4 won three and was runner up in three. Academy Awards were won by Stanton Lions for Small Club Project of the Year, Madison Berry of the VBA Leo Club for Leo of the Year and Lions Scott and Diane Quinlan for Couple of the Year. Honorable Mention awards were won by Buena Park Noon Lions for Free Eye Exams and Glasses, Pomona Host Lions for the "Lions Little Free Libraries" and Seal Beach Lions for Club of the Year. We are so proud of all of you.

Membership numbers continue to climb. As of this writing LCI is at 1,422,230. MD4 is at 20,707 with a net gain of 620 members in 740 clubs with two still pending. L4 is at 1,391 with a net gain of 161. We chartered a new club in April which is the Marshall B Ketchum Optometry School in Fullerton. The charter was submitted with 29 members and they have an additional 60 membership applications to send in.

Our District Convention is just around the corner. I hope that many of you will be able to attend at least a part of the convention. It is being held at the Pala Mesa Resort in Fallbrook from May 19th through the 21st. Hope to see you there.

I want to thank all of you again for allowing the Governor's team and Cabinet to serve you this year. We have all worked hard to make this year a success and help everyone by "Joining Hands in Service."

Dear Lions Members of the Sight and Hearing Foundation:

After much discussion and consideration, the Sight and Hearing Foundation Board has decided to discontinue use of and retire the van. It is now twenty years old and it is costing more to maintain it each year. After talking with other van committees up and down the state in MD4, we have found there are very few handling many screenings and several are also retiring their vans.

On top of that the use of the van by member clubs in the District has fallen lower and lower each year. This past year alone the van has only been used a total of four times by three different clubs. This is not cost effective. We realize that the ability of groups like the California Lions Friends in Sight to provide glasses on site provides a way for many of our District clubs to provide service to their communities in a different way. Other reasons many clubs do not use the van is the difficulty of finding helpers, drivers, doctors and those in need. Many screenings are very low in attendance, as we can only screen and not supply glasses or have any way for lower income patients to get help.

It is our desire to either help, financially, the California Lions Friends in Sight or find a way to help our member clubs pay for vision help of District 4-L4 community members that local clubs have a hard time doing. We can do this with the help of clubs using the Spot Scanners, and referring the patients out for low cost vision care and glasses. This is a work in progress, and we hope to have more information on our plan as time goes by.

We have always appreciated the support and input from member clubs and all District 4-L4 members. We thank you for the continued support. We appreciate any suggestions for our ongoing efforts for Sight and Hearing.

Over 60 attendees enjoyed a yummy lunch, 10 vendors sharing their wares and six models showing off very pretty fashions from Dress Barn San Dimas. Thank you to everyone who came out to support us, including members from <u>Ontario-Upland</u> and <u>Pomona Host!</u>

<u>CDH Lions</u> also had a very successful fundraiser selling Jack-in-the-Box booklets chock full of 2-for-1 coupons, raising many hundreds of dollars to support our Eye Clinics, Blind Buddies Golf, Rising Stars and many others. April was a little more on the quiet side for the <u>Ontario-Upland Lions</u>. We had a lovely speaker from Healthy Living, Shelly Manning, come and speak to our club. For Christmas, we chose to have a gift card collection instead of a club gift exchange. We donated the gift cards to Healthy Living to help with their gift program for those less fortunate. We are looking forward to continuing that partnership in the future and looking for additional ways we can help the community. We have also been very busy getting ready for our annual tea on Saturday, May 13. Hope to see you there!

<u>Upland Host Lions</u> enjoyed having PDG Ken Myers speak at their general meeting. He spoke to us about District 4-L4 and how it compares with other Districts in MD-4. Our District is a leader in the MD-4 group of Districts, in most performance categories. We lead everyone in our Diabetes awareness programs and 4-L4 has the most LEOS in <u>all</u> of Lions. We lead MD-4 in support of the annual Lions Rose Float and the Lions Camp at Teresita Pines. PDG Ken spoke more about the facilities at Lions Camp at Teresita Pines and the Lions Camp at Wrightwood and how it takes support and personal elbow grease of all Lions in MD-4 to maintain and improve these facilities. Teresita Pines covers 3.5 acres, has 15 sleeping cabins and 4 VIP cabins available plus many other facilities to be used by the campers. Wrightwood Village covers 20+ acres, has 8 sleeping cabins and full facilities for all kinds of camping activities. Wrightwood can accommodate campers with special needs. Both of these camps welcome groups of all types, not just limited to Lions. Ken also spoke about our local project, the Chaffey Community Center, and described the many improvements taking place there. Regional Indian Groups are working with the Center to add a typical Indian Village as part of the many historical settings being developed at the site. Our club has committed to assist the Community Center in continuing this development.

The <u>Ontario-Host Lions</u> have realized this since 1995, when PDG/PCC Ed Bordenkircher developed the student-of-the-month program which has recognized over 100 students from the Chaffey High School District with a special lunch and a \$ 25 gift card and certificate. They just sponsored eight Leo members and their advisor, Sheri Richardson Rojas, to attend the leadership camp in Teresita Pines to experience and learn some very important leadership skills such as; conflict resolution, public speaking, team building and leadership responsibilities. The Leo's are doing a park clean up at Red Hill park on April 22, Earth Day, and a beach cleanup in San Juan Capistrano on May 13th. The club knows how important LCI's literacy program is and will send volunteers to the Montera Elementary School in Montclair this month to read to students and put on a Flag Day program. With school coming to an end club members are looking through several applications and will award one very deserving high school student a "Homer Briggs Scholarship" of \$2000 for the college of their choice.







This April the <u>Pomona Host Lions</u> kicked off its service activities on the first day of the month with a food drive at Albertson's for the Pomona Unified School District's God's Pantry. The shoppers were generous, buying 75 bags of groceries and additionally donating \$120. Now that the homeless shelter is year-round instead of just winter, the Lions are cooking and serving one dinner a month. Also, with a focus on eliminating hunger, club members handed out bags and boxes of food at the Kennedy-Austin Foundation.

Continuing its literacy programs, the <u>Pomona Host Lions</u> distributed books to first graders at two more schools with over 95% of the families living in poverty. By the end of May, the club will have given out over 1,000 books to first graders at nine schools. Stewards of the seven Pomona Host Lions Little Free Libraries/mini-libraries kept busy regularly stamping books with the club information and then placing them in the libraries so there will always be a good selection. Other Lions transported donated used books. Thank you to John Ulrich of the **Laguna Niguel Lions** for helping us keep our children's books in stock!



The <u>Pomona Host Lions</u> also had several community involvement projects this month. The club put on the Easter Egg Hunt, bean bag toss and giant bubble activity at Ted Greene Park, and it worked on the Ganesha Park Beautification Project. At the annual Community Volunteer Recognition Presentation, the Pomona Host Lions received three awards from the school district, one from the local assemblyman and one from the city.

Culminating a very active month, the <u>Pomona Host Lions</u> held its first ever Quartermania, which helped raised money for its service projects. Thank you to all the District Lions who came out to give their support!

A good time was had by all participants at the event.

The April 17th meeting was the induction of two new members; Zina Stagg sponsored by Lion Cindee Quan and Anna Jung sponsored by Lion Jack Tanaka. PDG PJ Smith did the induction. Thank you PDG PJ for doing a great job! The <u>Diamond Bar Breakfast Lions Club</u> had two major events in April; the City Celebration and the Easter Egg Hunt. The four Leo Clubs (Chaparral MS, Diamond Bar HS, Lorbeer MS, DB Community) helped at both events. The DB Community Club Leos are preparing for their Installation on Monday, May 15th and the Lorbeeer Leos Installation will be on Tuesday, May 16th. The Lorbeer MS Leos volunteered at Ranch Elementary with their fundraiser and the DB Community Leos completed their cereal collection for the Shepherds Pantry. We collected a total of 103 pairs of eyeglasses for recycling. The Diamond Bar Breakfast Lions Club had four Lions attend the District 4-L4 Student Speaker Contest on Saturday, April 22nd. We also supported the Friends of the Library's Wine Soiree fundraiser on April 23rd.

The <u>Walnut Lions</u> are extremely excited that their club sponsored student speaker Natalie Jiang who won the District 4L-4 Student Speaker Contest. 
SADDLEBACK REGION ZONE B




