# DISTRICT 4-L4 CONSTITUTION & BYLAWS PROPOSED AMENDMENT Effective July 1, 2018

#### Proposal 1:

#### CONSTITUTION - ARTICLE VI OFFICERS AND DISTRICT CABINET

**SECTION 2. DISTRICT CABINET.** The district shall have a district cabinet composed of the district governor, the immediate past district governor, the 1st vice district governor, the 2nd vice district governor, the region chairpersons (if the position is utilized during the district governor's term), the zone chairpersons, a cabinet secretary/treasurer, or a cabinet secretary and a cabinet treasurer. These cabinet members are considered voting members. Non-voting members of the district cabinet shall include the public relations chairman, district global membership team (GMT) coordinator, district leadership team (GLT) coordinator, district Global Action Team coordinators, district newsletter editor, the district photographer, the district chaplain, the assistant district chaplain and the district webmaster. Each such officer shall be a member in good standing of a Lions club in good standing in the district

**Submitted:** Lion Cathy Waters, Harbor Mesa Lions Club

**Purpose:** To be inclusive of all members of the Global Action Team – membership, leadership and service.

#### Proposal 2:

#### BYLAWS - ARTICLE VI DISTRICT CONVENTION

**SECTION 7. OFFICIAL REPORT.** Within fifteen (15) days after the close of each single and sub-district convention, the cabinet secretary shall transmit one copy of the complete proceedings to the international office. Upon written request from any club in the respective district a copy shall be furnished to said club. (add) Within sixty (60) days after the close of each single and sub-district convention, the convention chairperson shall present a financial accounting of said convention to the governor and the budget and finance committee.

**Submitted:** Constitution & Bylaws Committee

**Purpose:** All district bank accounts should be reviewed and/or audited on an annual basis by the governor and the

budget and audit committee.

#### Proposal 3:

#### **BYLAWS - ARTICLE IV DISTRICT COMMITTEES**

**SECTION 4. STANDING COMMITTEES** 

#### (A) BUDGET AND FINANCE

5. Maintain, oversee and keep accurate records of the District 4-L4 reserve account(s).

**Submitted:** Constitution & Bylaws Committee

**Purpose:** To bring the district reserve account(s) under the Budget and Finance Committee.

#### Proposal 4:

#### BYLAWS - ARTICLE VI DISTRICT CONVENTION

SECTION 9. ELECTIONS COMMITTEE. The district governor shall appoint a non-district officer chairperson. The committee shall be composed of the chairperson, representing his/her region, and one representative from each of the other regions who shall be a member in good standing of a Lions club in good standing in the district. The elections committee shall supply a ballot listing the candidates nominated for election and proposed amendments as submitted by the constitution and bylaws committee for each voting delegate at the district convention. The committee shall count votes and report the results to said convention.

**Purpose:** To list the appointment process and duties of the Elections Committee.

#### Proposal 5:

#### **BYLAWS - ARTICLE XI MISCELLANEOUS**

**SECTION 11. CONTRACTS.** No contracts obligating District 4-L4 shall be signed by anyone other than the current governor.

Purpose: To establish who is permitted to sign contracts for the district.

#### ANOTHER VIEW OF LEADERSHIP FROM LION MICHAEL SHAW

Too many people think leadership is about control. In fact, great leaders inspire and then get out of the way. They know that talented people don't need or want hovering managers. Leadership is about influence, guidance, and support, not control. Look for ways to do your job and then get out of the way so that people can do theirs. The truth is that not everyone can lead, and there is no substitute for natural talent. For those who fall somewhat short of being a natural born leader, leadership skills can be acquired, honed and perfected.

True leaders understand empathy, and have the ability to read people's needs and desires. This allows them to speak to these needs and, when at all possible, to fulfill them. When people feel they are understood and empathized with, they respond and a bond is formed. Great leaders respond to each challenge with a fresh eye. They know that what worked in one situation may be useless in another. Before they act, they make sure they understand the specifics of the situation and act accordingly. Nice leaders don't "finish last," they finish first again and again.

Ignorance and arrogance are leadership killers. They're also a mark of insecurity. Treating everyone with a basic level respect is an absolute must trait of leadership. Of course, there will be people who prove they don't deserve respect and they must be dealt with. But that job will be made much easier, if you have a reputation for kindness, honesty and respect.

Not a week goes by that we don't hear about a so-called leader losing credibility because he or she was dishonest. Often this is because of pressure to try and "measure up" and it's not coming from a place of being real - often this relates to fear of not being accepted for your true self. We live in age of extraordinary transparency, which is reason enough to always be true to your core – your mission will be revealed, your motivations will show by your behaviors. If you have a reputation for honesty, it will be a lot easier to deliver bad news and face tough challenges.

Things like operating automated measuring instruments, assisting doctors, or helping patients with their "new" eyeglasses. When you become a CLFIS volunteer you are rewarded with often overwhelming gratitude from the people you served and stories to tell of the smiles that appeared right before your eyes.

- Lions Districts select and submits one winning photo to the Multiple District by April 30, 2018.
- MD-4 shall select the winning photo by May 31, 2018. The winner shall be announced and the submitted district photos shall be displayed during the June 2018 Council of Governors meeting.
- An award will be presented to the winning photographer and the photo will be featured on the MD-4 website.
- Contest photos become the property of MD-4. MD-4 reserves the right to disqualify entries that do not meet contest criteria or that may be viewed as inappropriate or objectionable.
- At all levels of the competition, photos will be judged impartially based on originality, artistic merit and technical quality.

#### A Client's Story

When Thomas Myles started losing his vision, it was pretty scary. He didn't have insurance, and he and his wife couldn't afford the \$300 - \$400 per month premium. But Thomas's job depended on his vision. He works in the printing industry as a pressman. "My job is my eyes," he told us. "Without my eyes, I don't have a job."

But his vision kept getting worse. "I couldn't even drive at night." He couldn't make the drive from his home in Beaumont to see his grandchildren in Riverside.

"I couldn't see colors. When I looked at black, I'd see gray. I was running my inks too high, and I had to ask for help."

A visit to the doctor confirmed that Thomas had cataracts in both eyes. "I was told my eyes were critical for cataract," he said.

"My wife and I talked, and the good Lord must have put something in her heart. She went to work."

Helen started looking for help online, and she found the local Lions Club in Beaumont, which referred Thomas to LSHF, where he was quickly approved for cataract surgery. "The day I found out, I said, 'Thank you, Lord,'" Thomas remembers.

After Thomas returned home from his first surgery, he took off the patch over his eye. "It was like someone just turned on a light," he says. "I could see in 3D."

Thomas soon had surgery on his other eye. "I can understand what a blind person goes through," he says. "I could hardly recognize my grandkids, and now I have it all back. You guys gave me back my eyes."

But Thomas's problems weren't over. Back at the print shop, he was surrounded by noise, and he had to keep asking people to repeat themselves.

"When my wife talked to me, especially on my left side, I couldn't hear. I noticed it was getting worse. When I talked on the phone, I had to put it to my right ear."

Thomas got his hearing tested and sure enough, he also needed hearing aids. He came back to LSH, and was approved for help.

Thomas is back at work, able to both see and hear.

"Now I can see my wife and my grandchildren, and I can keep my job," he says. "You guys gave me back my eyes."

This is one of the many stories of LSHF. There is no cost to the client or any Lions Club. If you know someone that could use help with eye surgery or h




