Hello Lions. I do not like change, mostly because I have no place to put it after leaving the drive thru. Of course, this is not the change I am referring to. Change makes me uncomfortable. I like routine and I like things staying the same. Recently, I purchased a new recliner because my old one had seen better days. I patiently waited for it to arrive, and when it did, I sat down looking forward to feeling the new plushiness. Imagine my surprise when it didn't feel the same way as the old one. I was disappointed, upset, and angry, because it was not what I wanted.

I wanted the comfortable feeling I have when I sit in the old chair. The old chair knew me; it wrapped around me like an old friend. Now I had two chairs, one old, one new. What was I going to do? I could remain in the past and enjoy the comfort of what I knew; or I could jump into the future and make the new chair a comfortable reclining experience.

The same is true of our clubs. Many of our clubs and members are satisfied to remain in the past. The past is comfortable. We like doing the same projects each year, with the same members in charge. We like believing we are still serving the needs of our communities, without really knowing if those needs are still valid. We like the people we have been with for the past 10, 20, or 30 years. We aren't comfortable with the occasional new member who asks too many questions, or wants to do something other than flip pancakes. We aren't comfortable when a new member sits at our table, in the seat Joe always sits at. We aren't comfortable when someone tells us our club is going to fade away; even when it actually is.

Each of us as Lions and each of our clubs should take an honest assessment of why we are Lions and why our club(s) exist. We should ask ourselves if we are happy being Lions. If not we should work to understand why and then finds ways to resolve it. Clubs should ask if they want to exist in the next 5, 10, or 20 years from now. If they do, then clubs need to understand what it will take to do so. Change for the sake of change is not a good approach. We need to take the best of our past and our traditions, embrace new technologies and understand current community needs, and forge a path to the future. We need to understand that when people say we need younger members, we are not just talking about people in their 20s and 30s. Younger members are people in their 40s and 50s, and for some clubs people in their 60s. Everyone wants to feel they are contributing to the needs of their communities regardless of their age or gender. We are all Lions. We can all Serve.

By the way, each day I sit in my new chair it gets more comfortable.

CABINET TREASURER REPORT



Club Treasurers: You should have received an email or bill from LCI. If not you can go into MY LCI, Club, Statement/Dues. Please pay this bill to LCI as soon as possible.

At the June Treasurers Class we went over Club Treasurer's responsibilities. If you were not able to attend the class and receive a work book may I suggest you go over the information I emailed to you after the session.

Today I'm going to highlight the following: You must accurately maintain club financial records. Maintain all club checking accounts and ensure they are reconciled with the bank statements. Receive all funds that the club receives and deposit into the appropriate accounts. Pay all club bills and donations as directed by the club board of directors. Maintain membership accounts and bill members for dues as directed by the board. Attend all club meetings and provide a report to the general membership and board of directors when asked. Pay all Lions Club International and Multiple District Four (MD4) dues on time. Generally look out for the financial well-being of your club. It is your responsibility to let your club members know if they are not staying within budget or update your budget to reflect the actual spending. This process should help make your club a more efficient club.

This request was presented to the District Cabinet after following the guidelines set down by MD4 Constitution & by-laws committee. The Cabinet held a vote on July 28th to consider; shall the district hold a special session to consider endorsing a candidate for International Director. The vote was unanimous to open the special session.

The rules state a 30-day notice must be given to all club Presidents, the club Secretaries and Past District Governors, of an announcement regarding the date of the special session at least 30 days after Cabinet vote, also a sample ballot and delegate form.


The candidate David Radtke, of the Orange County Central Lions meets all the qualifications to hold this office and therefore is seeking the Districts endorsement.

- 1. The date has been set for Saturday September 8th, 2018.
- 2. The location will be the Garden Grove Host Lions clubhouse 9860 Larson Ave. Garden Grove, CA. 92844
- 3. The registration and delegate certification shall open at 8:30A.M. & the special session will begin at 9:00 A.M. for the candidates nomination and seconding speech. Delegate forms will be sent out to Presidents, Secretaries and PDGs soon
- 4. The voting will be from 10:00 A.M. To 11:00AM

GLOBAL LEADERSHIP TEAM (GLT) UPDATE

LEADERSHIP THROUGH SERVICE AND COMMUNITY EVENTS

How do you know if you are a leader? There is a pretty simple test question: "have you created a vision of something to be done, and then, followers have joined you to get it done?" If the answer is yes, then you are a leader. If it is no, then you aren't a leader yet. Don't worry, it is simple to be a leader, and it is also not easy.

John D. Rockefeller, the hugely successful US entrepreneur, said, "Good leadership consists in showing average people how to do the work of superior people." The same principle is true of Lionism as well. I will give you two examples of events which through service to the community, yields excellent returns.

First is the La Habra Lions La Habra CornFest, on August 2nd-4th. This event generates funds for both their admin and charity accounts via different mechanisms. They are warm, inclusive and supportive of other organizations, the business community and invite their fellow Lions to support, attend, or be a part of it. From their website, it was a single Lion that started this incredible, signature event, "The La Habra Host Lions Club organized in 1947. One of its members, Bill Miller, was instrumental in helping the new club form a major annual fundraiser. Bill knew that Southern California had many transplanted mid-westerners and suggested that the Club start an old-fashioned corn festival." Here we are, years later and now this event is entrenched in not just Lions, but La Habra and the surrounding community.

Next is the Seal Beach Lions 74th annual Fish Fry, which just happened July 21st & 22nd. It started with only a few members and has persisted and grown for decades. We even had the Canyon County (Thousand Oaks, CA) Lions Club executive committee come to the event to learn in their words, "the most successful Fish Fry in the US." Ironically, looking back through the minutes of the Seal Beach Lions Board of Directors, the following was said by Secretary Buell Brown in 1951, "It is the only event of the year that brings the people of the town together for a good old fashion visit, and that one item make our Fish Fry a truly worthwhile Lions activity. The Fish Fry has never been operated with the idea of making any money, just friends, yet it has never failed to pay us for our effort, with a nice sum for the treasury." In 2018, those words are still entirely accurate and relevant.



So, what are you going to ask new members or revitalize existing members? Try this, "what new service project or community event would be great for our town?" The answers might surprise you, and suddenly, a leader along with followers emerge.
