

Hello Lions. On April 28th, 1st VDG Randy and I attended the charter celebration for the OC Marshall B Ketchum University Lions Club. IPDG Bob Susaeta and I helped organize the club and the Tustin Host Lions serve as their sponsor. Originally formed a year ago, the students' schedule did not allow for a charter ceremony until now. The club consists of Optometry, Pharmacy and Physician Assistant students. Consider asking them to be a program at your club meeting. This month, I would like to highlight stories from the student's mission trip to Mexico along with Lions Friends in Sight.

This spring break I had the privilege of participating in a vision outreach trip for the people in Moscota and Talpa Mexico with Dr. Van de Pol (Lion and adviser to the club), Dr. Tania Mantua and Lions In Sight. I'm immensely grateful to Dr. Van de Pol for giving her time and organizing these trips which help so many people in need. During the 4 days of clinic we served 1,200 patients. As a first year student, I was able to apply my knowledge from the classroom to real life while also learning clinical skills that most learn second year (such as MIO and trial frame/refraction). We saw a variety of systemic and refractive cases. One memorable case was an 80 year old aphakic patient who I worked with. He was practically walking around blind but left the clinic with a pair of +13D lenses and a huge smile on his face. The memories made taco hopping, churro trying and learning Spanish with my classmates will also never be forgotten. It is trips like this that remind you why we sit in the classroom and work so hard. I encourage everyone to go on an outreach trip during their time here at MBKU, I know this won't be my last.

Traveling has always been about connection for me - connecting with locals, experiencing a new culture, trying the cuisine and learning about a history different from my own. Things were no different when travelling to Mexico. This spring break, I spent it connecting with and serving roughly 1,200 patients from Talpa and Mascota on a medical mission trip with Dr. Van De Pol, classmates and several Lions club members to Mexico. Whether it be the vast, green mountainsides neighboring the ranch we stayed and celebrated at after



our first day of clinic, the many mom-and-pop restaurants we'd experience on our bumpy bus ride up to Mascota, the delicious midnight tacos and handcrafted guacamole from the food truck right outside of our apartment in Talpa or the 14-year-old myope I was able to refract (Rx of OD: -24.00-1.75X180 and OS: -18.00-2.00X180) and provide glasses for for the first time, Talpa and Mascota left me feeling inspired by the stories of my patients, appreciative of optometry in developing areas, and longing for a life fueled by simplicity as those I've witnessed in Mexico. If I could, I would do it again, and I would urge any student on the fence about spending their school breaks on a mission trip to just do it. The things you learn and experience on these trips will follow you for the rest of your life. These things, too, will make us better doctors, clinicians, and people at the end of the day.

The highlight of the vision mission for me was learning how to think on my feet to find the best solutions for my patients. Given that we did not have many resources at our disposal, my colleagues and I were encouraged to make the best with the equipment that we had. We got to practice techniques that broadened our skill sets and prepared us to improvise in clinic. One such technique that we practiced is called monocular indirect ophthalmoscopy (MIO). For this technique, we used a 20D lens and ophthalmoscope to examine the patient's retina without having to dilate them. Another technique that we were exposed to is called trial frame refraction, where we were able to determine the patient's description without needing a phoropter. Both of these skills are not something that are typically taught in optometry school curriculums, so it was great to get exposure to them on this trip. I hope to continue to foster these skills in preparation for future mission trips!

DISTRICT 4-L4 CONSTITUTION & BYLAWS PROPOSED AMENDMENT Effective July 1, 2018

Proposal 1:

CONSTITUTION - ARTICLE VI OFFICERS AND DISTRICT CABINET

SECTION 2. DISTRICT CABINET. The district shall have a district cabinet composed of the district governor, the immediate past district governor, the 1st vice district governor, the 2nd vice district governor, the region chairpersons (if the position is utilized during the district governor's term), the zone chairpersons, a cabinet secretary/treasurer, or a cabinet secretary and a cabinet treasurer. These cabinet members are considered voting members. Non-voting members of the district cabinet shall include the public relations chairman, district global membership team (GMT) coordinator, district leadership team (GLT) coordinator, district Global Action Team coordinators, district newsletter editor, the district photographer, the district chaplain, the assistant district chaplain and the district webmaster. Each such officer shall be a member in good standing of a Lions club in good standing in the district

Submitted: Lion Cathy Waters, Harbor Mesa Lions Club

Purpose: To be inclusive of all members of the Global Action Team – membership, leadership and service.

Proposal 2:

BYLAWS - ARTICLE VI DISTRICT CONVENTION

SECTION 7. OFFICIAL REPORT. Within fifteen (15) days after the close of each single and sub-district convention, the cabinet secretary shall transmit one copy of the complete proceedings to the international office. Upon written request from any club in the respective district a copy shall be furnished to said club. (add) Within sixty (60) days after the close of each single and sub-district convention, the convention chairperson shall present a financial accounting of said convention to the governor and the budget and finance committee.

Submitted: Constitution & Bylaws Committee

Purpose: All district bank accounts should be reviewed and/or audited on an annual basis by the governor and the

budget and audit committee.

Proposal 3:

BYLAWS - ARTICLE IV DISTRICT COMMITTEES

SECTION 4. STANDING COMMITTEES

(A) BUDGET AND FINANCE

5. Maintain, oversee and keep accurate records of the District 4-L4 reserve account(s).

Submitted: Constitution & Bylaws Committee

Purpose: To bring the district reserve account(s) under the Budget and Finance Committee.

Proposal 4:

BYLAWS - ARTICLE VI DISTRICT CONVENTION

SECTION 9. ELECTIONS COMMITTEE. The district governor shall appoint a non-district officer chairperson. The committee shall be composed of the chairperson, representing his/her region, and one representative from each of the other regions who shall be a member in good standing of a Lions club in good standing in the district. The elections committee shall supply a ballot listing the candidates nominated for election and proposed amendments as submitted by the constitution and bylaws committee for each voting delegate at the district convention. The committee shall count votes and report the results to said convention.

BYLAWS - ARTICLE XI MISCELLANEOUS

SECTION 11. CONTRACTS. No contracts obligating District 4-L4 shall be signed by anyone other than the current governor.

POMONA HOST NEEDS USED CHILDREN'S BOOKS FOR LITTLE FREE LIBRARIES



Do you have used children's books you no longer want? The Pomona Host Lions Club needs them for its Little Free Libraries! Keeping all six Pomona Host Lions Centennial Legacy Little Free Libraries (LFL) and three mini-libraries well stocked is an ongoing challenge, and sometimes our storage facility runs low, especially in children's books. We absolutely love seeing the excitement when the kids find LFL books they like, but that means they are often very slow in returning them (think library books with no late charges).

More than 90% of Pomona children come from families in poverty, and they have few or no books in their homes. These neighborhood LFLs provide access to books when a trip to the library is impossible or impractical because of lack of transportation, limited library hours or the parents' extended working hours. Whenever children read books of all kinds, their literacy levels and academic achievement increase, thus allowing a greater opportunity for future success.

Currently, the Pomona Host Lions have Little Free Libraries at three city parks, two Laundromats and in the front yard of a member's home. They also have mini-libraries at the food pantry, homeless shelter and women and children abuse shelter.





Dear District 4-L4 Lions,

As you honor your members at year-end and plan your charitable donations for next fiscal year, now is the time to include the California Lions Foundation (CLF). It is a great foundation for Lions Clubs in California as all donations to CLF will stay in California as matching project grants or as restricted designated charity project funds. Please consider a \$1,000 Kay K. Fukushima Fellow for a deserving member.

CLF matching financial grants will be available to clubs and districts to meet various needs and projects in their respective communities. The dollar range of CLF grants will be focused on projects from \$500 to \$10,000 which do not qualify for support from other Lions foundations. Nonetheless, a CLF grant can also be combined with a LCIF grant for larger projects.

As a 501(c)(3) nonprofit corporation, CLF also accepts tax deductable designated donations for projects of individual Lions Clubs that are preapproved by CLF. CLF then provides the designated donations back to the club for use of their approved project.

CLF would like to remind you that the Foundation was created to provide matching grants to California Lions Clubs for humanitarian, vision, environmental, disaster relief, and other projects to better serve our California communities. A dollar amount of \$250,000 was established as a charity fund goal prior to issuance of grants. With your support we are closing in on that figure. We currently have almost \$155,000 in charitable donations and anticipate the approval of club grants to start within the next year. Please see our CLF brochure below.



Now is also the time to purchase your raffle ticket for a beautiful jeweled pendant created and donated by PDG Alberto Montes de Oca. I will continue making my way around to club and district meetings offering the tickets for sale. You can also mail me a check payable to the California Lions Foundation and I will return your ticket stub. Thus far I have sold 85 tickets. The pendant is 14K white gold with diamonds, blue sapphires, rubies, blue topaz and garnet and has an estimated retail value of about \$10,000. Raffle tickets may be purchased for \$20 each from me, and all proceeds will go solely into the administrative fund at CLF. The drawing will be held July 1, 2018 during the California breakfast at the LCI convention in Las Vegas. All raffle ticket purchases should be sent to Gil Smith.


