CABINET SECRETARY REPORT



Secretaries, you are doing a great job. For the September reports we had a great response and reporting by a majority of the Club Secretaries. You are doing an amazing job of it. Thank you each and every one. However, I do need to give you some secretary work. First, please go into MyLCI and clean up your members' information, especially the email addresses. We are able to send out emails twice a month through MailChimp to every Lion in District 4-L4 and we need every member's correct email address to do so.

Second, Lions International has changed things up under member information and now requires that we put full birthdates in. Please work on this as you can, we would like to get District 4-L4 ahead of the game. You will notice the dates all have 1/1/xxxx. These need to be corrected. Some secretaries have already taken care of this, but I would ask the rest to get onto this. Also, in some cases there is bad or missing information highlighted in red. Please correct this also.

The activity reports are outstanding. Along with the usual reports of meetings, hours spent on board work, reports on programs like the chess program, cookies for heroes, book and reading programs, vision and diabetic screenings, platelet and blood donations, eye exams, graffiti clean-up, flag day presentations, school box projects, centerpiece donations, Peace Poster Contests, Special Olympics, eyeglass collections, pop-top collections, Ronald McDonald House volunteers, Leos, there are also reports on Casino Nights, Tustin Tiller Days, Silverado Days, 5K runs, golf tournaments, pancake breakfasts, fish frys, arts and crafts events, International Street Fair fundraisers and speakers information, District, Region and training reports in these reports. There are some interesting events that we don't ordinarily hear about like Fullerton's work with the Caring Hands Pantry and their work with Veteran's Meetings, there is Seal Beach's work with the Youth Center Foundation and a donation acquired from Wal-Mart of 30,000 pair of readers, a big Coastal Cleanup, and Newport Hawaiian (who donated \$500), Pomona Host and Diamond Bar (who donated \$1000) attending the Camp at Teresita Pines event. There is Greater OC doing a wheelchair drive for vets, helping a cancer patient with shopping and cleaning, collecting used furniture to help homeless transition to housing and OC Professionals volunteering at Jurupa Valley Community Food Fest sorting donated foods at the Feeding America Food Bank, Pomona Host feeding homeless at the city shelter (purchasing, making and serving), the OC Chinese American Club holding a Med-Fall Moon Festival, Ontario Upland with two members donating blood, Diamond Bar walk for homeless and hunger and volunteering for Inland Valley Hope Partners Farmer's Market and recycling cans and bottles to support a Special Ed. Class. There is Tustin Host volunteering at the Tustin Area Senior Center, at the Tustin Area Historical Society and the Youth and Family Center to help in need and youth at risk and the OC Korean Club donating \$1000 to the Korean Thanksgiving Feast and La Habra Host cleaning a channel that leads to the ocean. Those are a lot of reports that we don't ordinarily hear about. Our District Lions Clubs are doing lots of things, aside from the ones we know.

The second District Meeting was a good morning with fun friends. It was an interesting, informative meeting filled with camaraderie. Thanks to all that made it a successful and fun event (Region Chair Bob Terry, the Zone Chairs present and all who attended). We are trying to scatter members to make sure we all can connect in one way or another.

MyLion is still not up and working, but I will keep watching for it and keep you and all secretaries posted. And please register and use the District Website. It is an invaluable tool for all of us. Once you get the hang of it you will get so much from it.

CABINET TREASURER REPORT



A Big Thank you to the 24 Club Treasurers that have paid their Clubs Dues to LCI and MD4. Eight Club Treasurers/Presidents received notices about being behind on LCI dues and eleven clubs received notices about being late on their MD4 Dues. The District only received a partial payment of the dues owed to us from MD4 last week. The reason for this partial payment to 4-L4 is that if the clubs in our District do not pay MD4, MD4 cannot turn around and pay the District. There is a budget set up at the beginning of the year. The District depends on dues being paid in order to have money to operate with. It is very important that each and every club pay the bills/invoices they receive from LCI and MD4 when they are received.

In January if you're dues have not been paid to MD4 your club will not be eligible to proceed with a Student Speaker Contest. Then in February your dues must be paid to both or your club cannot vote at the MD4 Convention. This is not only DUES it also means if you order supplies of any kind from LCI. 

2018 YOUTH EXCHANGE PROGRAM OUTGOING STUDENTS INFORMATION - Lion Diane Quinlan, Chair

There is no longer a flat fee per country, there is now a required \$250 filing fee that must be submitted with each application. Please make the checks payable to MD4 YEP. This fee includes shirts, name badge (if going to Japan), backpacks, MD-4 Youth Exchange Pins & banners and orientation booklet. Students will be required to book their own travel in accordance with the Camp or Host family acceptance letter. Students will also be required to provide health, accident and travel insurance that MUST be accepted in the country they are visiting. A copy of their travel itinerary and insurance MUST be provided to the MD4 YEP Chairperson, District Chairperson and the Camp or Host Family they are visiting. Please note there may be additional camp fees payable to the camp, but not all camps charge a fee.

There is a deadline of March 5th to turn application into District Chairperson Lion Diane Quinlan. District Chairperson MUST sign your application for it to be accepted. Please note that some countries deadlines are prior to 3/5/18, so understand that your spot is not guaranteed until we receive your completed paperwork, \$250 filing fee and confirmation from the country that they have accepted you. Camps have limited spaces so this is a first come basis and they fill up fast.

As a participant students can expect to be immersed in a unique cultural experience with Lions clubs members supporting their learning. If the stay includes a host family, the host family will treat them as a member of the family, expecting their engagement in typical daily routines and family meals. If the stay includes a camp know each camp has a theme from outdoor activities to sightseeing and more. Be sure they understand each camp before selecting one. Feel free to contact District Chairperson Diane Quinlan at 714-623-1439 with any questions. Some are camp only, host family only or a combination of both.

YCE (Youth Camp & Exchange) participants must:

- Be between the ages of 15 ½ and 22. Requirements vary at each camp.
 - Be sponsored by a Lions club and understand you will represent your community, country and the sponsoring Lions club.
- Welcome the opportunity to explore the customs of another culture.
 - Provide proof of insurance (health, medical, travel) and a liability release agreement.
- Provide copy of a valid passport.
 - Take initiative to learn the language of the host country (i.e. basic greetings and phrases).
- Write a personal letter of introduction to your prospective host family that contains information on the following: interests, studies, hobbies, family, home community, previous travel experience, expectations for the program, and any dietary, health or religious requirements. Please submit this letter with your application along with a few photos of you.
- Attend the District Orientation Meeting with your parent(s).



The event was also visited by Lions 4L-4 District Governor, Randy McMillan and 1st Vice-District Governor, Mark Piva, both of whom were thrilled with the support and robust nature of the Fair. They reminded everyone that every dollar raised by Lions or Leos goes to the charity account to be given away, as we have no paid staff.

On September 29th Lions Gretchen Bornhop and Angie Canchola acted as bartenders and Rudy Huezo was the official photographer at the Casa Youth Center Casino Night fundraiser. Besides the three, another 20 **Seal Beach Lions** were there having a great time and gambling the night away. It was a very successful event with more than 150 people






