A MESSAGE FROM FIRST VICE DISTRICT GOVERNOR MARK PIVA



Hello Lions. It is common to hear people say, "All service organizations are losing members." "No one wants to do community service anymore." "Young people do not join organizations." You may recognize these comments, or even made them yourselves.

Recently we began making official visits to clubs in the District. The average number of Lions per club in our District is 26 (when you remove the three largest and two smallest clubs). Over the past several months, I have spoken to many Lions whose clubs are in stasis or transition. These clubs may be experiencing no growth, loss of members, or stagnation. Some of these clubs have even accepted they will fizzle out and are just waiting to shut off the lights and close the door.

What does it mean to be a club in transition? I define club transition as a recognition of needed change to create an environment of service that is sustainable. Transitions are difficult though; partly because some members are comfortable with the status quo and partly because a club isn't sure how to transition or what to transition to?

Transitions are not done in a single year; if done correctly transitions are part of a long-term plan. First, someone needs to take the lead to champion a path to the future. This means they will identify what needs to be done and to gather a team to help define the mission and vision of the club and develop a plan of how to get there. Second, part of the research done by this team is to survey members and people in the community to understand what members want and what needs exist in the community. Third, a plan is developed and presented to members for discussion and approval. Finally, a leader needs to be selected who will ensure the plan is implemented and carried out.

If you are in a club which wants to grow in order to provide more service to the community, or to re-energize its reason for being, then accept responsibility to take the lead in moving your club forward. Avoid being one of those people who spout the questions asked at the beginning of this note, and take no action. Be the person who leads your club forward, continues to open new doors of service by doing new things, and is not overwhelmed by making a mistake. Be a leader!

I'm pretty sure most of you can because you have shared many of them with me. As I visit more and more clubs I have had the opportunity to listen to them. And each time I marvel at what I have heard from Lions who reached out to help another and received more in return than they gave.

Why did you become a Lion? In the future, I hope to hear more of your stories that answer this question.

PEACE POSTER CONTEST 2018

This year the theme of the Lions Clubs International Peace Poster Contest is "KINDNESS MATTERS." Young people (ages 11, 12 and 13 by November 15, 2018) are eligible to participate in the contest which provides an opportunity for them to express their visions of peace through art. Participants can use a variety of mediums, including charcoal, crayon, pencil and paint. (No computer art is allowed) The works vary greatly and reflect the young artists' life experiences and culture. Lions clubs around the world proudly sponsor the contest in local schools and youth groups.

The deadline for ordering the Peace Poster kits is October 1, 2018. Please contact Lions Clubs International to order the kit by either calling Club Supplies at 1-630-571-5466 or ordering the kit on line.

I will need to know your Club name and how many entries you will have. Club entries can be given to either your Zone or Region Chair or be taken directly to the District meeting on Saturday, October 20th where they will be judged. Please make sure that you follow the directions for labeling each poster entry.

The winning poster will be sent on to the next level of judging (the MD4 contest) by the District Governor by December 1st. The Multiple District winner must be submitted to the Public Relations Department of Lions Club International by December 15th. The winner will be notified on or before February 2, 2019. The winning poster will receive a cash award of \$5,000 and a trip to a special award ceremony. 23 merit winners will receive a cash award \$500 and a certificate of achievement.

California Lions Foundation

The California Lions Foundation (CLF) is growing and being responsive to the needs of California Lions clubs. CLF now has about \$170,000 in its accounts. This includes charities/activities and administrative funds, as well as designated donations. CLF is well on its way to the established funding goal of \$250,000 in order to begin providing grants to California Lions clubs, which should commence in the 2018-2019 Lions year. Recently CLF has responded to the spate of serious fires in our state by accepting designated donations to help provide wildfire relief.

CLF wishes to again acknowledge the outstanding support of about 85 individual Lions and nine Clubs and Districts for becoming 'Founding Members' of CLF. CLF also has received one corporate donation of \$5,000. The CLF Board is expanding efforts to obtain additional corporate and company support. Nonetheless, our biggest challenge remains getting the word out to all California Lions clubs on all the opportunities to donate and on the benefits CLF can bring to California communities through its Lions clubs.

CLF also generated \$12,280 in gross receipts from the pendant raffle held July 1st in Las Vegas. The lucky winner was Lion Josephine Louie from the Los Angeles Envision Lions Club. Thanks to all the Lions who participated in this necessary administrative fundraiser and special heartfelt thanks to PDG Alberto Montes de Oca for donating his time, talent and ALL materials that went into the pendant.

As you know, the California Lions Foundation (CLF) was created to provide matching grants to California Lions Clubs for humanitarian, vision, environmental, disaster relief, and other projects to better serve our California communities. These matching financial grants will be available to clubs and districts to meet various needs and projects in their respective communities. The dollar range of CLF grants will be focused on projects from \$500 to \$10,000 which do not qualify for support from other Lions foundations. A CLF grant will also be able to be combined with a LCIF grant for larger projects.

CLF is a great vehicle to help Lions Clubs meet our community needs in California. All donations to CLF will be provided back to the Lions Clubs of California as matching project grants or as restricted charity project funds. As a 501(c)(3) nonprofit corporation, CLF can also accept dedicated tax deductable donations for charity projects of individual Lions Clubs approved in advance by CLF. CLF then provides the designated donations back to the club for use on their approved project.

District 4-L4 is the second highest giving district in MD4. Thanks again for all your support of CLF.
