




Leadership Training Stipend

Moving beyond the cliches to action is never easy.

Cliches can make us look smart. One of my favorites from the 1980s (I read a lot of history books) is "paradigm shift".

A paradigm shift is an important change that happens when the usual way of thinking about or doing

something is replaced by a new and different way. It is usually suggestive of an evolutionary change. Lions are going through a paradigm shift and some are further along than others.

Paradigm shifts are real, fundamental changes. For example, it is one thing to say "Kindness Matters", it is entirely different to behave in a way that shows we truly believe it. When we do the latter, we are actually engaged in the paradigm shift. Other cliches and phrases fall into this approach as well, "Be liberal with your praise", "We need younger people", "We need more women in our organization".

These are all nice things to say. Our responsibility, if we say these things, is to truly believe them and take action to bring them about. If kindness matters, then we ourselves need to demonstrate this. We need to be kind to others, especially those in our clubs who are not part of the in-crowd. We need to be liberal in our praise in action, not words, in public and in private.

During this season of reflection, I ask you to consider the things you say and ask yourself, if I really believe this what am I doing to make it happen. Pick two or three to work on in 2020. If we all do this, then we will be closer to bringing about the paradigm shift our association needs.





I spent the last few years with Lion Seth forming our District's approach to Leadership Development. We always put the District and members first and found the best path. Together, with the leadership team, we provided top-notch workshops and encouraged leadership at the club level. We were successful because of Lion Seth's infectious enthusiasm, energy, and insight.

Lion Seth would not want us to mourn (at least not for long). He would want us to start playing reveille; to pick up the flag and carry it further; to think of him, smile, and say I want to do more. Not more like him, but more like ourselves.

To find that spark of kindness in ourselves and share it with the world around us.

Let's take a moment and honor both of our colleagues, Judge Townsend and Seth Eaker for the life they lived and the example they left for the life we can choose to live.
