

District 4-L4 relies on each club paying their dues/invoice so that the District can operate. As stated prior, if your club secretary did not drop a member prior to December 31, 2018 your club is charged for that member by both LCI and MD4/4-L4. The two important dates for dropping members is June 30<sup>th</sup> and Dec 31<sup>st</sup> or that Lions membership is charged.* 

There is no forgiveness anymore from LCI/MD4/4-L4. It is very important that each and every club pay the bills/invoices they receive from LCI and MD4 when they are received. If you have a student participating in the Student Speakers Contest you must pay your dues immediately when received or they may be prohibited from going on to the next level.

Recently, your Sight and Hearing Foundation has been maintaining and mostly storing the S&H van. Since our 4-L4 clubs were no longer using the van, the Board of Directors voted to donate it to the very grateful Ensenada Lions who now use it extensively in reaching out to rural areas and providing much needed screenings.

For decades the van was the face of S&H in 4-L4. Not the same van. (The original had been restored, refurbished, re-equipped and eventually replaced) It served a great purpose and some of us will miss it.

But now what? Since we no longer had the van as a focal point of our service, the Board looked for other opportunities to serve. Donation of the van freed up our budget and enabled us to contribute \$25,000 to Southern California Sight and Hearing Foundation. We continue to collect used hearing aids and provide new ones to the needy. We maintain a grant program of up to \$2,000 to our 4-L4 clubs for eye care screening and glasses. We are supporting a raffle for a week's stay at a 4 or 5 star resort to benefit California Lions in Sight. We are in the process of forming a partnership with California Lions Friends in Sight.

Finally, because we have term limits on the Board of Directors, we offer you the opportunity of determining the future of the District 4-L4 Sight and Hearing Foundation. Your club may nominate you to serve on the board (the board meets four times a year). A letter or email from you club president addressed to Lion Tom Hollister (<u>bertntom@aol.com</u>) is all it takes to put you on the ballot. Nominations must be made by May 3<sup>rd</sup>.

It all started back in 2008. Little did I know that a cosmetic surgery to remove a wart would change my life forever. By that time, I rarely ever heard anyone speak about 'cancer" nor did I know anyone close to me that has been touched by this disease. Not

knowing what cancer really was, I was quiet about it, didn't talk about it, or let alone have anybody give me sympathy for what I went through! I wanted to continue living as if nothing ever happened!

Cancer changes people. It sculpts us into someone who understands more deeply, hurts more often, appreciates more quickly, cries more easily, hopes more desperately, loves more openly and lives more passionately.






