

#### Taking the "Long View" of Leadership

Harry S. Truman, the 33rd President of the United States of America famously said, "Men make history, and not the other way around. In periods where there is no leadership, society stands still. Progress occurs when courageous, skillful leaders seize the opportunity to change things for the better." Other than not being gender inclusive, as I read "men" in that sentence as "people," his message is more accurate about Lionism than one might think.



Though I have not been a regular commentator in the Forum (my sincere apologies to Lion Cathy Waters, our fabulous Editor), I have often reflected on submitting pieces, and almost always something comes along and pushes the pile of my "priorities" or "urgent" matters that it hasn't gotten done. Why does this happen? Well for all of us, the reality is quite simple - we are volunteers. It does not matter your age, years of Lionism, awards received, service projects done, or size of your club, at the end of the day, we are all just trying our best to meet our motto of "We Serve."

As a result, many leaders have been actively challenging the status quo of our world of Lionism. I am proud to see that 4-L4 through several leaders have continued and pushed forward the need for change, growth, and development. District Governor Randy McMillian, along with VDGs Mark Piva and Steve Lacey have been blazing a trail ahead, which is both inclusive and forward-looking. Thanks to Lion Leaders like my GLT co-chair Annette Hatch, who informs our Leadership training to a high degree and my Zone Chairs: Craig Durand and Alexis Morgan, both of who are not only Zone Chairs, additionally, they are the District Chairs of Diabetes and Pediatric Cancer, respectively.

We all know that "doing what we have always done" is not the answer to address the Millennial generation or Generation Z which will follow. In a January 17th, 2019 article, the Pew Research Center determined the following, "Generations are often considered by their span, but again there is no agreed upon formula for how long that span should be. At 16 years (1981 to 1996), our working definition of Millennials is equivalent in age span to their preceding generation, Generation X (born between 1965 and 1980). By this definition, both are shorter than the span of the Baby Boomers (19 years) – the only generation officially designated by the U.S. Census Bureau, based on the famous surge in post-WWII births in 1946 and a significant decline in birthrates after 1964."

Thus, at 46, I am near the center of Generation X, while most of the current leaders and mentors I see in Lions are the Baby Boomers (PDGs, PCCs, PIDs, etc.) or even the Silent (sometimes called the "Greatest") generation which came after World War I.

We are now seeing the impact of Millennials in our clubs, and they often have families and differing views on social and economic issues. We need to find out what they want to do and how they want to serve. We must embrace technology, remote access to clubs, perhaps even virtual events and fundraisers. How is that going to happen? I don't know, but don't you think we should start asking those who are younger? Why not invite your LEO presidents to your club's board meetings. Ask them what they think of the issues that you and your club think are essential. When did you last do a survey of club members or the community leaders around you?

What is needed in the changing face of the community from which your club burst forth? One club comes to mind in particular, which is all white, while their LEO clubs are all a specific Asian population. Why aren't there any of the parents of the LEOs in the leadership or even membership of that club? I mean no disrespect for this club, as it is and has been an enormous resource for leadership this year, and I still feel that it is relevant to ask these questions, don't you?

So where does all this leave us? In the words of the famed English biologist, Charles Darwin, "It is not the strongest of the species that survives, nor the most intelligent, but the one most responsive to change." Taking the long view of leadership will result in our ability to not only survive yet thrive. I believe that Lionism will succeed. Thank you for all those who have in ways both big and small produced incremental, positive change for our clubs, district and ultimately LCI if not the world.

#### RONALD MCDONALD HOUSE WALK SUNDAY APRIL 7<sup>TH</sup>

This District-Approved Project was an absolute success! District Chairperson Lion Brenda Donahue and her amazing husband, Lion Dan of Greater OC Lions, worked tirelessly for several months coordinating food, work crews, cooking, and booths. Dan and Brenda went to grocery stores, coffee houses, and fast food places to ask for donations of the items needed to serve VIP Donors of the Ronald McDonald House event. They also got several clubs to volunteer their labor and food items.

Recognition of the groups that helped is in order. <u>Clubs</u>: Greater OC Lions supplied popcorn and cotton candy at a booth in the kid zone. They gave out 300+ bags of free popcorn and cotton candy on a stick. They also provided members to work setting up the VIP tent and food booth, loaded and unloaded the vehicles and set up generators for power. Plus they donated money to help purchase food items. Chino Valley Lions brought their world-famous ice cream truck and had lines about 20-30 deep of people waiting for a free cone. They probably served 400-500 ice cream cones! Orange County Central Lions provided all of the meat for the VIP breakfast. This is their third year in a row. They also supplied two booth workers. Huntington Beach Host Lions cooked up some awesome pancakes and served breakfast to hungry VIPs. Stanton Lions provided a cash donation to help purchase food supplies. Stanton has a line-item budget for this event and it was appreciated. Perhaps in the future, more clubs can set aside a budgeted amount for this worthy event! It is a District-Approved project and could certainly use the donations!

Thanks to Brenda's tenaciousness, she got Starbucks to donate 100 cups of coffee, the Grocery Outlet in Orange supplied plates, utensils, and \$100 store credit, the McDonald's restaurant on First St. in Tustin provided syrup and butter packets, and Ronald McDonald House donated a lot of pancake mix, coffee, plus additional syrup. Other vendors provided water, juice and fruit served at breakfast.

The Fountain Valley High School LEOs were on hand to serve food, clean tables, and deliver food to paid vendors who were unable to take a break to eat.

Governor Randy rounded up walkers who took part in the 5k walk/run. In total over \$300,000 was raised. Lions of District 4-L4 raised \$2,730. It was a little short of the \$5,000 goal set for our district this year, but the more clubs who support this amazing event, perhaps next year we can break our previous records!

Again, Lion Brenda Donahue wanted to thank everyone who participated by walking, virtual walking, donating food items, donating funds, or volunteering to work starting at 4 am! Without everyone's help, it would never have been so successful! Our District should thank Dan and Brenda Donahue for their hard work and dedication to this project. Next time you see them, tell them "Thanks!" We appreciate all that you do!!

Restoring Vision - Preventing Blindness

#### District Team Concept Launched in Santa Ana



After a 2-year long volunteer recruiting and training campaign, the new California Lions Friends in Sight team of District 4-L4 Lions held their first free vision screening in Santa Ana on Saturday, April 13.

Hosted by the Santa Ana, OC Central and Tustin Lions Clubs, a total of 396 people were seen by an eye doctor. Of those, the 335 who

needed eyeglasses got eyeglasses, fitted and adjusted by professional opticians.

A total of 35 District 4-L4 Lions successfully performed everything from registration, operating automated testing instruments, verifying Rx test results, assisting doctors, computer prescription matching, and helping patients select eyeglasses.



This team will go on to conduct 4 more vision screenings this year and another 5 dates are already on the calendar for 2020

Children are a gift to the world, yet every two minutes a child is diagnosed with cancer and less than half of the world's children have access to effective care. Children who survive cancer are often left with debilitating effects that can impact their physical development and ability to learn. That's why Lions and Leos are answering the call to expand access to life-saving treatment and support the children and families who need us most. We are working to give children with cancer a second chance at life.

#### District 4L4 Pediatric Cancer Chair

First, I'd like to introduce myself to you. My name is Alexis Morgan and my world was turned upside down when I heard the words "you have cancer"



when I was just seventeen years old. XOXO's usually mean hugs and kisses. For me, it has gotten a whole different meaning....

It all started back in 2008. Little did I know that a cosmetic surgery to remove a wart would change my life forever. By that time, I rarely ever heard anyone speak about 'cancer" nor did I know anyone close to me that has been touched by this disease. Not

knowing what cancer really was, I was quiet about it, didn't talk about it, or let alone have anybody give me sympathy for what I went through! I wanted to continue living as if nothing ever happened!

Cancer changes people. It sculpts us into someone who understands more deeply, hurts more often, appreciates more quickly, cries more easily, hopes more desperately, loves more openly and lives more passionately.

We gratefully accept donations of gently used books, both fiction and non-fiction for children and adults. We are especially in need of books for children of all ages. The club has continued to provide a meal once a month for the homeless in Pomona, now at Hope for Home, the new shelter that recently opened. Members prepare and serve food to 150 to 180 individuals. 


#### **ORANGE REGION ZONE C CHAIR CRAIG DURAND**


#### SADDLEBACK REGION ZONE B CHAIR MORGAN HUANG


