

#### S.S. Spirit to Serve takes Sail.....1st District meeting a huge success

All hands were on deck on Saturday, August 15th as District 4L4 gathered together virtually for the first time under the leadership of Captain/Governor Steve Lacey. Twenty-one of our clubs (plus two Leo clubs) were represented as over 80 people gathered for this 90-minute meeting.

The glitch-free meeting moved quickly through its agenda as nearly twenty Lion leaders spoke on topics such as LCIF, the Operation Christmas Soldier project, Peace Poster contest, Speaker's contest, and reports from all the alphabet including our GMT, GLT and GST (pardon my alphabet).

Though meeting in person would have had its advantages, this meeting was slick, quick and left everyone with most of their day ahead of them. So how do you improve on a meeting like this? Read

Just as one example, over \$5,000,000 has been donated in the past few months to COVID Relief efforts, \$3,000,000 of that to projects right here in the United States. Now to what Seal Beach is doing. During our recent District meeting, Lion President Stan Sarkauskas presented a check for \$10,000 for LCIF, a donation designed to help underwrite those worthy endeavors. Yes, I said, \$10,000.

This check was part of a 5-year, \$100,000 commitment that Seal Beach has made, the largest such commitment of any club in North America. We can not thank the Seal Beach club enough for their continued generous donations to all aspects of our Lions work.

What a great day was had by one and all when on Sunday, August 9th, over 100 Lions gathered together in Huntington Beach to say a fond farewell to the 2019-2020 Lion year. Welcomed by PDG Ellen and Mike Liebherr, a delicious luncheon was enjoyed by one and all followed by the presentation of 50 awards and recognition by IPDG (that stands for Immediate Past District Governor) Mark Piva.

The number of awards given was impressive. Even more so were the number of clubs and individuals who received these awards. This was not an 'Oscar' sweep night where one club or one person took

home all the awards. The 'breadth and depth' of dedicated, devoted and spirit-minded Lions was seen in how many different people and clubs received those awards.




